### YOU SAID: ABTI SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

**WE DID:** We are continuing our proactive patrols of ASB hot spot areas. We have been visiting local parks in the evening, with the darker nights we are aware that anti social behaviour will be on the increase. ### YOU SAID: ROAD SAFETY

**WE DID:** Lots of residents have been sharing their concerns around vehicles driving unsafely and particularly regarding speeding through our villages. In response to this, we will be running a speeding campaign throughout November in various locations in order to educate and enforce as appropriate. ### YOU SAID: RURAL CRIME

**WE DID:** We continue to work closely with our partners and ensure that local contacts throughout the villages are kept up to date. With proactive patrols and having specialist trained officers on hand, we are able to focus on the issues and crimes that are more specific to our rural beat locations. We have two Wildlife Crime Officers on the beat, PC Statt and PCSO Vaughan, that are passionate about all things rural!

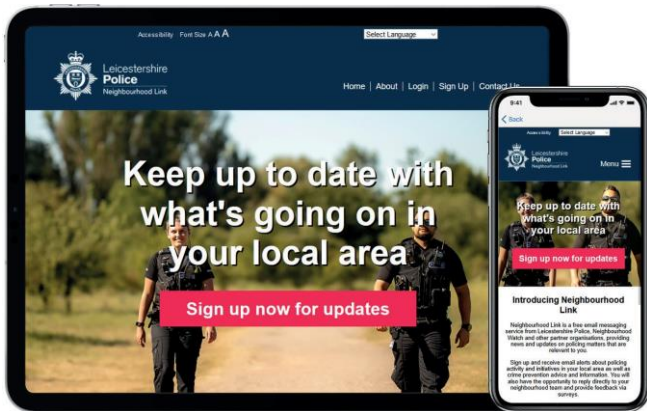
Please be considerate of others when using fireworks, use them safely and responsibly, and ensure all waste is disposed of to protect our wildlife.
