Proactive Traffic Enforcement Operation:

With the support of our colleagues from the Environment Agency, the Driver Standards Agency and Leicestershire Police's Road Policing Unit. The beat team ran an operation along the A447 on Friday 5th April 2019 targeting vehciles in poor condition.

The operation saw a number of vehicles stopped with tickets being issues for a variety of offences. Common themes included illegal tyres, expired MOT, no seat belts and loose or dangerous parts.

With such a large area to police these kind of operations are a real good opportunity for us to find out who is using our road network to commit crime and allowed us to focus on vehciles towing plant and trailers to ensure everthing is above board and legal.

With the continued success of these operations, another operation will be planned on the beat for later this year.

Our thanks to Dobbies Garden Centre for allowing us to use an area of their carpark to complete checks on the vehciles stopped throughout the day.







All Parish Meeting:

On Monday 15th April we help out 'All Parish' meeting at Bosworth Hall, all of the parish councils across our beat area were invited to attend where information about Leicestershire Police was shared and attendees were given the opportunity to raise any concerns within their community. Representatives from 10 of the 42 Parishes attended these being Desford, Cadeby, Bagworth, Thornton, Sutton Cheney, Shenton, Witherley, Carlton, Sheepy and Stoke Golding all attended the meeting and some really positive comments were received. We assume that with the other 32 not attending that they have no concerns with policing in their area. It is likely that a further All Parish meeting will be planned towards the end of the year.

Anti-Social Behaviour:


