The month of October has arrived and we always find that this month can be a very demanding one for us with celebrations for Halloween, Diwali and Fireworks events coming up. We would again urge parents and others who work with young people the importance of staying safe and not to engage in Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) when they are out and about. As a beat have received - 442 calls, 62 of these were 999 calls. As always the calls we received were for a variety of purposes, including 20 reports of ASB, 11 Burglaries and 88 road traffic incidents.

OP PIONEER – Theft of Tools from Vans:

Op Pioneer is a planned operation to tackle the increase in thefts from vans of power tools. Over the last 6 weeks there has been an increase across the whole force in this type of crime and we are no different on our patch. A gentle reminder to those who own vans to make sure expensive items that can be carried easily such as power tools and similar are removed from your vehicle overnight. Remain vigilant and if you see any suspicious behaviour call Leicestershire police on 999 and provide a detailed description and the direction that the person/s have gone off in.

Community Consultation

YOU SAID, WE DID:

DESFORD/LEICESTER FOREST WEST – Breach of no entry by vehicles travelling to the industrial premises on Peckleton Lane. High visibility patrols conducted at key times, a number of offending vehicles stopped and given words of advice. We are working with the local businesses to ensure key messages are shared with their staff.

MARKFIELD – Reports of drug dealing and drug use around the local parks and community centre. We have increased our patrols and are working with the Parish Council and staff at the community centre to increase our intelligence picture and identify those responsible.

GROBY – Quarry Park has recently been subject of criminal damage, we have increased our patrols at the location and have been working with local schools and the Parish Council in exploring opportunities to deal with offenders and prevent similar incidents from occurring.

NEWBOLD VERDON – Reports of anti-social behaviour and drug use in the area with a focus on the pavilion. We have increased our patrols in this area resulting in some individuals being stopped and searched and a quantity of drugs being seized. We have also as a result of intelligence conducted a warrant at an address in the area where cannabis was found to be growing. We will continue to patrol this area and deal with offenders accordingly.
