As you will know, Sylvia and David at Creaton Village Shop and Post Office wish to retire and even though they have had the shop on the market for some time, there has been little interest. Therefore the shop is to close early next year.

This is of course sad news for all of us in Creaton and the surrounding villages who have used the shop to get their newspapers, fresh milk and bread and buy those things you find you have run out of. It will also be bad news for us all as the loss of the Post Office will mean no more cash dispensing, no more posting parcels and packages, no more foreign currency on your doorstep. If you have your prescription delivered to the shop, this will stop.

However, all is not lost. A group of very concerned residents have got together, with the support if the Parish Council, to form a Working Group to launch the **Save Our Shop** campaign.

This questionnaire is the first step on the journey to retaining a shop and Post Office in the village. Please be honest and as realistic as possible in your answers. Your responses will be treated in confidence. It is entirely anonymous, unless you wish to add your name at the end.



## **Questionnaire Results**


Approximately 400 questionnaires were distributed. Every household in Creaton, Cottesbrooke, Hollowell and Teeton received a copy. An electronic version was sent to someone in Haselbech for distribution; copies were left in the pub in Thornby and contacts there notified via Facebook. A number of questionnaires were also given out in the Post Office which resulted in returns from Spratton, Brixworth, Old and Long Buckby.

199 questionnaires were returned, 103 from Creaton households (49.67% out of 207 households in the parish). The following results are for Creaton residents only. For information regarding the wider returns (ie from other villages) please contact Richard Hollingum).



Yes: 103 (100%)




Q2 What products would you be most likely to buy?





Q3 How often do you think that your household would use the shop and Post Office?

Q4 What services would you be most likely to use?











### Q7 Please state how many people there are in your household, and their ages.
