Share Window Extended

As the figure is on the way to the maximum of £80,000, the Management Committee have taken the decision to keep the Share Window open until the end of January. Chairman Charles Matts says that by doing this it is hoped that as many people as possible can become part of Creaton Community Shop.

For £20, anyone over the age of 16 can become a member of the Society and therefore have a say on how the new shop should be run and help launch it into a successful future.

Since the original artist's impression was drawn by Chris Reading, the planning application was successfully approved. Now the details of the proposed building can be seen in more detail and Chris has created a new version.

The new shop will be a modular building, constructed of material as secure as bricks and mortar but quicker to erect. At the front of the building is a canopy to offer bus passengers shelter from the weather.
