An Important Message for all Society Members Seed Enterprise Investment Scheme

If you bought shares in Creaton Community Benefit Society you will recall that you may be able to claim back some of that expenditure in tax relief. This is part of the Seed Enterprise Investment Scheme (SEIS) and is a method whereby the Government supports such community ventures by offering relief to eligible taxpayers.

You may also remember that you would be unable to do this until the shop had been operating long enough to satisfy the Inland Revenue. This period of time is nearly completed and we are preparing for the next stage which is to inform the IRS who the share holders are who will be claiming.

The Society will be submitting a form detailing those shareholders who wish to claim, as indicated by ticking a box on the form you completed when buying your shares. It is some time since you completed that form and your circumstances may have changed so we would like to give you the opportunity to confirm that you wish to be able to take advantage of the SEIS.

To do this you can either send an email to Jane Kimberlin, Society Secretary societysecretary@creaton-villageshop.co.uk or write a letter to Jane confirming, addressed to the Society Secretary and hand it in at the shop.

You must respond by 4pm on Monday December 24th.
