2023 has been the best year yet for Penlow in terms of wildflowers.

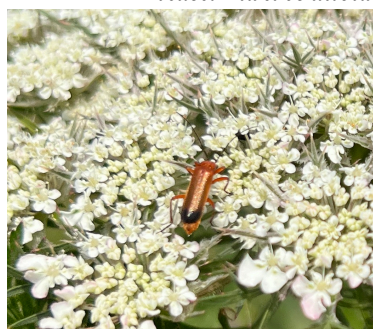
The oxeye daisies have really flourished and have spread well in both burial areas.
