## Tree plantings...

I have now contacted everyone who's choice I don't already know for trees that are due to be planted this season. We have made a start and this year we are trialling a new mulch mat. This is biodegradable and will disappear in a year or two. Before that - it will do some very important jobs:

Firstly it will keep any grass growth away from the tree base to allow the roots to establish more easily.

Secondly it will retain the moisture of the rain to help keep the tree fed in the summer months.

Thirdly, they retain the heat from the sun.... when it comes along!
