*Office re-paint:* This is still ongoing, but it will be complete in 2022.



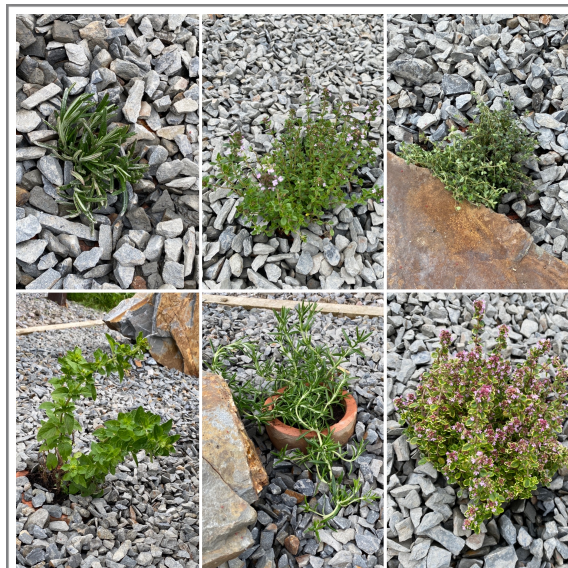
### Mushrooms galore...
