# **SHEEP**

In the summer, as usual, the sheep were sheared. Gathering them for this purpose was made easier by improvements to the sheep pen.

## **POND**

A lot of work was done, clearing the pond of excess weed, before the frogs and newts began to spawn. We used a grappling anchor and rakes, and even donned waders, to enable us to dredge weed from the bottom. We pulled fallen branches out of the water, and cut back overhanging ones to give more light and to reduce falling leaves.

## **STUDENTS**

The Castle volunteers have continued to work with a group of young people from Tarbert Academy each week during term time. The youngsters have been developing their understanding of rural matters, as well as learning a variety of skills which will be useful to them in the future, in addition to helping to maintain the Castle site.
