What matters to you

#YOU SAID, WE DID

You said: Anti-social behaviour was a priority.

We are continuing to tackle those committing anti-social behaviour in key areas such as Groby, Ratby and Markfield. Offenders have been highlighted and spoken to in recent weeks and multiple out of court disposals have been handed out in a bid to reduce this type of offending early. Residents are remined that anti-social behaviour is treated very seriously and offender will be dealt with if they are found to be committing anti-social behaviour.

You said: Road safety continues to be an issue

Officers from the Market Bosworth Beat Team have visiting local primary schools this month to tackle reports of parents parking on zigzags, blocking pavement and driveways at school drop off. Words of advice was issued to those found to be doing the above and we will continue to patrol around the local school sat school pick up and drop off to take positive action against those that are not abiding by the law.

You said: Rural Crime is priority.

Members of the Market Bosworth beat team and the Rural crime team partnered up to attend the Rural Conference to provide a Q and A as well as a presentation to local councillors, residents and business owners across all villages to answer questions relating to Rural crime in the area and what we are doing to tackle may issues raised. A positive opportunity for community engagement.

What we are doing

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following in October 2023.

Priority 1: Road Safety

You said: That Road Safety issues are your number 1 concern.

What we are going to do: Target those who drive without any insurance or in a reckless or dangerous way.

Priority 2: Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)

You Said: Anti-Social Behaviour including use of motorbikes on open spaces was an issue to you.

What we are going to do: Conduct patrols of key areas reported to us, deal with offender through a multiple agency approach.

Significant quantities of drugs, cash and weapons sized during week of County Lines activity

Warrants, arrests and safeguarding visits were carried out during County Lines Intensification Week – the national week of action to target County Lines drug dealing, disrupt the supply of drugs and raise awareness of Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE).

Cash, drugs, and weapons were seized during the week which ran from Monday 4 March until Sunday 10 March.

Through activities including warrants, ANPR operations and priority patrols in hotspot areas, Leicestershire Police:

- Mapped new County Lines
- Made 42 arrests which included mapped County Lines members
- Executed 40 warrants
- Led two ANPR operations leading to six arrests and interrupted the supply of class A and B drugs
- Recovered significant weapons including a homemade taser
- Seized over £24,000 and 120 Euros in cash
- Seized quantities of drugs including £6,000 worth of crack cocaine and 437 cannabis plants
- Seized designer clothing worth over £10,000
- Carried out 25 safeguarding visits
