29/30 A member of the public spoke about how Stoke Golding's draft plan includes an area of separation between the two villages and that Dadlington's plan will have the same. The new MP has sent a letter of support for this. The member of the public also commented that the DNP grant has been successful and that easier access to the money is needed.

DADLINGTON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

DEFECTIVE STREETLIGHT IN DADLINGTON

- 37/20 It was unanimously agreed to commission LCC to repair the defective streetlight on Hinckley Road in Dadlington by upgrading it as part of the LED upgrade scheme

SUTTON CHENEY ALLOTMENT

- 38/20 It was unanimously agreed for Cllr Tebbett Mills to formally represent Sutton Cheney Parish Council for Sutton Cheney Allotment group

PLANNING

- 39/20 No planning applications were received

FINANCE

- 40/20 It was unanimously agreed to approve the financial statement for January 2020
41/20 It was unanimously agreed to approve and sign the cheques

CLERKS REPORT

- 42/20 The Clerk gave the following report:
- The CPIF grant payments have been processed, including a retrospective increase in payment for streetlights project due to significant delays from HBBC and LCC
 - An application was made to CPIF grant for next financial year for two defibrillators in the telephone boxes in Shenton and Sutton Cheney. The village gateway project was put on hold until further information could be sought
 - Problems with the bank mandate and lack of signatories caused problems with payments over January for the Parish Council which have all now been resolved
 - Need to re-organise group training with LRALC
 - There has been an insurance claim regarding the work at Rose Bank which is being managed by the Council's insurance.
 - VAS signs should be in place by the end of February

MEMBER'S REPORTS

- 43/20 Cllr Mayne has attended 4 different DNP meetings as well as the Heritage meeting at the Atkins Building, discussing the heritage trail around Hinckley and expanding it out to villages including Dadlington, Stoke Golding and Sutton Cheney.
- 44/20 Cllr Tebbett-Mills confirmed delays with the 1485 trail with August 2021 being the anticipated date of completion.
