#### **COUNCILLOR VACANCY**

One application was received for the vacant seat in Dadlington ward. It was unanimously agreed to co-opt Mrs Lynda Spencer as Parish Councillor for Dadlington.

## **DRAFT BUDGET**

The Council discussed the draft budget for 2022 – 2023. It was suggested that the finance committee meet before the next Parish Council meeting to agree to a more detailed case for adoption in January.

- The Clerk has approached other Associations of Local Councils as well ACRE members in the East and West Midlands to find suitably qualified consultants to quote on feasibility study for the Royal Arms development – quotes to follow
- Dates of 25th and 26th November have been confirmed for the tree work on Dadlington Village Green and Sutton Cheney allotments
- Three bins have now been purchased in kind by HBBC 2for Sutton Cheney at the Square and the Royal Arms car park, 1 for Shenton to be sited at the aqueduct entrance. Should be installed by December 21
- The Clerk awaiting confirmation of match funding from Canal & Rivers Trust for the defibrillator proposed
