## Defibrillator installed outside The Plough

You may have noticed a defibrillator has been fixed to the pub wall just inside the car park of The Plough. For several years the Parish Council has been looking for a suitable site in the village for this life saving piece of equipment (*part funded by London Hearts*), so we are delighted and deeply grateful to the owners of The Plough for allowing us to place it here and use their electricity supply to keep the external casing at the correct temperature.

A defibrillator is a device that gives a jolt of energy to the heart; it helps get the heart beating again when someone is in cardiac arrest and their heart has stopped. If someone is in cardiac arrest, call 999 and start CPR. The Plough staff or the 999 Operator can tell you the code to access the defibrillator.

## Be a litter hero


We regularly organise community litter picking events to help keep our village tidy and free from litter.
