Renovating the War Memorial

The Parish Council has been considering how best to renovate the War Memorial in the village. It has stood the test of time well but the planters are rotten and now in need of replacement. As the memorial faces North and is situated next to a dense hedge it receives little sun. It is very difficult to grow plants and therefore we are considering a suitable replacement.

The plan we have decided to explore is to have a new memorial stone in the centre at the top of the steps. This stone memorial will have fixed to it a new brass remembrance plaque, to replace the now weathered, worn one, with the names of the fallen engraved on it.

We are also considering replacing the paving steps with natural stone and widening the whole length. Consideration will be given to accommodate a poppy wreath or to place a small poppy or cross by those individuals who wish to remember the fallen.

Our tried and trusted flagpole will remain, so that the Parish Council can fly our National flag on all occasions. As is our custom - a poppy wreath will be placed by a Parish Councillor on

Remembrance Sunday at the War Memorial, Plumtree Parish Church following a Church service and The British Legion placing their wreath.

Village Conservation Plan Update

The purpose of the Conservation Area Appraisal is to: • Identify and record the special interest of the Conservation Area to ensure there is a public awareness and understanding of what is worthy of preservation.
• To define and reassess current boundaries to accurately reflect what is now perceived to be of special interest. • To identify opportunities to safeguard and enhance the special interest of the Conservation Area. Extra planning controls are in place to help manage change in conservation areas so that the 'special interest' can be preserved.

The Borough Council have recently completed their review of the Conservation Area status and the extent of the boundaries to the area identified back in 2009. We sought to extend the boundaries to include the whole of the village envelope including between Old Melton Road and Clipston Lane. The Borough initially proposed to take out of the plan Old Melton Road, however they agreed it should continue to be included but were not prepared to extend the envelope — we did request that several very old outbuildings on Back Lane be identified for future protection though. The final Appraisal is awaited and we will incorporate a link in a future Newsletter so that parishioners can view the results on line.

As previously mentioned the PC receive NOTW planning notifications from RBC and although the PC have no powers to indicate consent/refusal, we can make observations and comments. Each application is carefully considered by the PC regarding its design features, impact on the neighbouring properties, street view and on the village as a whole, as per Planning Policy Legislation.

New purple glass bins

You may have received an additional purple glass bin from RBC; under this new service, the glass collected can be mixed of any colour. Collections starting from December, will be detailed on the new collection calendar RBC will distribute shortly. The aim will be to collect on same day as residents' current grey bin collections on every sixth week.
