

Covid update

- Infection rate has decreased now to 4.7/100,000 (17 May). 11 cases across Highland over the last 7 days so positive sustained low numbers (Scotland=36.7/100,000)
- Test positivity 0.2% (0.5% last week)
- Small number of cases per neighbourhood majority are not being highlighted as won't disclose where there is less than 3 in any neighbourhood.
- Increases in certain Local Authority areas across Scotland highlighting virus is still around therefore very important to still stick to:



Vaccination programme update

Good progress is being made in Highland:

- For NHSH area as a whole, over 167,000 first dose vaccinations have been administered which is 71.9% of the over 16 population against a Scottish rate of 68.7%
- Vaccination has reached:
 - Second Dose
 - 95.8% of over 80's;
 - 97.4% of 75 79's;
 - 97.6% of 70 -74's;
 - 94.1% of 65 -69's;
 - First dose:
 - 98.8% first dose and 48.7% second dose 60 64's;
 - 97.8% first dose and 37.7% second dose 55-59's;
 - 88.7% first dose and 30% second dose 50-54's;
 - 65% first dose 40-49's.

Asymptomatic Community Testing

- Assisted LFD testing through the Community Testing programme mobile units becoming the norm. 2 Council vehicles supporting this
- Already deployed in Inverness and this week been in Thurso and Wick note no outbreak but to help support normalising testing.
- Will be deployed to different communities on a weekly basis

- No appointment needed
- Asymptomatic testing and LFD collection




Ranger Patrols on initial lockdown easing

- Existing staff patrolled 5 areas on Saturdays after restriction easing in April, covered 88 sites in
 - NW Sutherland, NW Ross, Loch Ness, Arisaig/Morar
 - And Glens Etive, Coe & Nevis
- Increase in motorhomes in north west. Camping in Lochaber (proximity to Central belt?), most with fires, (Glen Etive-53 tents, Arisaig 10+ on 1st May)
- Litter & locals camping near Loch Ness
- Submitted bid to NatureScot Better Places 2 fund for 7 posts.
 Collaborated with Wester Ross Biosphere, Skye Connect, Visit Inverness Loch Ness and Applecross Trust

Seasonal Access Rangers

- Better Places 2 funding confirmed, extra 7 posts in addition to 10 THC funded.
- 13 Rangers started on 10th May. 4 Rangers will start on 31st May
- Induction- SOPs and SOAC training. Countryside site & Core path management. Discussion/presentations with Police, Fire Service, Parking Enforcement & Waste Management.
- Supplied with badged vehicle, toolkit and uniform.
- Site visits with Outdoor Access staff.
- First patrols on 15th & 16th May





Access Ranger Patrols- first weekend

- 13 Rangers covered 11 routes in Highland, monitored use at 157 sites & spoke to 190 people
- Slight reduction in motorhome numbers, still mostly in west and north
- Fewer tents in Glen Etive but constant in Arisaig. Present elsewhere but smaller numbers and mostly responsible.
- Many fire sites cleared, 3 extinguished in risk site.
- Many site maintenance & fly tipping issues noted for action.
- 1 motorhome waste reported to Waste team
