1. Apologies:	1a. Apologies were received from or on behalf of: Angelina Wassell, Andrew Nicholson, Olivia Birch, Maggie McCowan and Robert MacIntyre.							
2. Declarations of interest:	2. There were no declarations of interest.							
3. Guest speakers:	<p>3a. Representative from Police Scotland: There was no representative of Police Scotland present at the meeting but a brief of reported crime in the area was submitted. Appendix 1.</p> <p>3b. Cdr James Leatherby: (JL) Provided a written report prior to the meeting. Appendix 2.</p> <p>3c. Jas Judge and Harpreet Kaur: JJ and HK introduced themselves to the meeting. They have taken over the running of the Rhu Post Office, preventing it from closure. JJ explained his background and experience. He has medical qualifications and is fluent in a number of languages. Having run a Post Office in Glasgow for 20 years he is an experienced Postmaster and was approached by the Post Office to run our office at short notice. JJ and HK are Sikhs and in celebration the anniversary of the birth of their religion they presented a cake. The Community Council welcomed the pair to Rhu and wished them well for the future; the cake was well received.

4. Minutes of meeting held 10th February 2016:

4. The minutes of the previous meeting held on 10th February 2016 were accepted as a true record of the meeting. Proposed BF, Seconded PPM.

5. Matters arising from minutes not otherwise on the agenda:

5a. The Police website has Garelochhead as the local Police Office for Rhu and Shandon. This is an error and will be corrected. It should of course be Helensburgh. We will no longer have a dedicated Police Officer for Rhu and Shandon but there is a team of 5 Community Officers who will share a larger area. Our website will be updated with further information. Cllr Freeman pointed out that the Garelochhead Police Office had been closed for more than two years and that the Helensburgh Police Office is responsible for all of the Helensburgh & Lomond Area.

5b. Rosslea Hall Hotel: The Police, Argyll and Bute Council Licencing (Mr Raymond Park) and Argyll and Bute Council Environmental Health (Mary Watt) in conjunction with the hotel management have produced a plan of action to minimise noise and disturbance. The CC will maintain a watching brief but have no desire to duplicate the work of these authorities.

5c. Third Sector Grants: JC wrote to all Councillors in Argyll and Bute to support the proposal to allow Community Councils to apply for Third Sector Grants. GF had continued to pursue this proposal that he had put forward to the Council but was disappointed that the Administration had not supported his proposal to introduce this change in financial year 2016/17. He had now been informed that the proposed change would not happen until 2017/18 at the earliest.

5d. Paths for All. It was too late for a bid in this round of funding The CC will consider getting a group together with a view to formulating a bid in the next round.

5e. 'Heartstart UK' is a British Heart Foundation initiative that teaches people what to do in a life-threatening emergency, under the principle 'simple skills that save lives'. A part of this is to locate defibrillators in communities and then set up training, which will be free and is aimed at the public. Two defibrillators have been confirmed for Rhu; at the Marina and at Rosslea Hall Hotel. Other areas such as Shandon and the upper parts of Rhu are also being considered. It was agreed that we should cooperate with this initiative by helping to set up the Training Days.

5f. Road Surface in Rhu. The A814 between Pier Road and School Road is in the Road Asset Management Plan and scheduled for resurfacing within this financial year and will be funded from the Council's Capital Budget.

6. Planning Matters: **6a. Ardenconnel Sports Pitch: 15/02729/PP.** The Planning Officer has recommended to the Planning, Protective Services and Licensing Committee (PPSLC) that this application be approved, subject to a pre-determination Hearing. The Hearing is an open meeting, and anyone who made a representation may speak. There were 36 objections on issues including parking provision, lighting, drainage and height of the surrounding fence, and the fact that the pitch is part of an Open Space Protection Area within a Conservation village. It is understood that the school will get free use of the facility during school time and for after school activities. In addition, block bookings for Rhu Amateurs may be permitted. JC will be representing the views of the CC at the Hearing, which will be held at 10.30 on 14th April in the Community Hall.

6b. Siting of Metal Storage Container (retrospective): 15/03082/PP. GF informed the meeting that the Enforcement Officer is dealing with it but is not a formal Enforcement Case at this time.

A number of people have had difficulty with the public part of the Council's planning website. It was suggested that a letter should be written to Angus Gilmore to alert him to the matter which is causing frustration to those trying to use the site. Some of the problems are technical and some appear to be due to human error.

6c. Wind Mast: 16/00230/PP. CC will maintain a watching brief monitoring mast following approval.

6d. Sea Lochs Trail; Rhu Plinth: 16/00174/AMSC. Plan Approved.

6e. Persimmon House Proposals: Glenoran Road. JR and several other CC members attended the pre-application and submitted comments at the time. 85 homes have been proposed by the developer which exceeds the planning allocation of 60 as described in the Local Development Plan. The road access arrangements are appalling and completely unacceptable. Drainage and flood prevention are big issues which will have to be considered in the planning process. There would be increased pressure on the school's ability to cope with extra demand. GF highlighted that the capacity of local schools was considered by the Council when large residential planning applications were being considered. The CC will be monitoring the planning application and will react accordingly.

7. Other Matters: **7a. Update of Broadband.** JC has written to Brenden O'Hara requesting hard facts but no response has been received. GF said that he has been pursuing high speed broadband on behalf of a number of communities in his ward and had sent an email to his contacts in Livingston who are dealing with this project to request an update. He expected further information to be made available soon.

7b. Horticulture/Open Public Spaces (Rose Bed and Barge Memorial Garden). There is no council money available for rose beds. PPM suggested that the rose beds be grassed over and planted with bulbs and in order to minimise the requirement for maintenance. LD said that the school couldn't do anything on H&S grounds. PPM proposed that the roses should be removed and replaced with bulbs. Seconded by JB.

12. Councillors' reports

12. MC. Reported that £150 funding had been made available for repairs and renovation of the Shandon War Memorial.

There are issues of pedestrian access to the Royal Northern and Clyde Yacht Club for the Rhu Gala this year and road management will have to be put in place.

There are problems with the lighting of the footpath between Aros Road and Ardenconnel Pitches. MC has highlighted the issue with the Base Executive Officer as it is the MOD's responsibility to maintain this footpath.

13. Members' Reports:

13a. PPM has obtained permission from OSCR to dissolve the playground charity.

13b. GK said that the drain at Orphir has now been cleared and this has reduced the amount of water lying on the adjacent road. The drain cover remains too far below the road surface and is causing vibration when heavy vehicles drive across. Additionally the resident of Orphir is concerned that this has the potential to cause damage to his car.

If you are concerned either you or a neighbour/relative is being contacted them please contact police. Particularly at this time of year we can experience an increase in Bogus callers offering to carry out gardening/maintenance work often at inflated prices for sub-standard work. If you are suspicious of any persons/vehicles in your area call 101.

Appendix 2: GUEST SPEAKER 2 – CDR JAMES LEATHERBY (JL) – REPORT

JL has provided the following report ahead of the above meeting:

- **Rhu (Ardenconnel) Playing Fields.** The public hearing for the proposed 3G artificial surface pitch is due to take place on Thu 14 Apr 16 in Rhu Community Hall. The Base, accompanied by the CEO of the proposed construction company, will present its case there. This will address the previously expressed fears about light pollution and general appearances.
- **Armed Forces Community Covenant Grant.** From a UK-wide pot of £10M, ABC has secured £333K. Specifically, the list of local successes features:
 - TS Neptune (Rhu-based Sea Cadets) – Replacement Minibus: £15,000
 - Rhu Community Hall – Replacement Gas CH system £20,000
 - BASIC & Cornerhouse Creche (Smugglers Way) £5,900
 - Project 81 Youth & Community Enterprise – Garelochhead: £19,680
 - The Tower Digital Arts Centre – Faslane Cinema Upgrade: £20,000
 - Argyll & Bute Council – Hermitage Park project: £253,000
- **Three Yearly Review and Reissue of the Public Information Leaflet in the Locality of HMNB Clyde.** The Radiation (Emergency Preparedness and Public Information) Regulations 2001 (REPPIR) booklet is about to be reissued to the residents of Rahane, Mambeg, Garelochhead, Faslane and Shandon. This is necessary to meet the requirements of the Regulations. Although amendments have been made to the layout and the format, in order to align them with current best practice, there has been no change to the material content.
- **The Clyde Local Liaison Committee.** The annual CLLC forum took place in the Clyde Off-Site Centre in Rhu on the afternoon of Tue 8 Mar 16. R&SCC was represented by Mr Tim Lamb; Argyll & Bute Councillors were also present. Presentations were made (which included reference to the item above) and questions answered. There were no outstanding actions.
- **Helensburgh Pier Development.** The Economic and Strategic Transport Lead Planner for Argyll & Bute Council has confirmed that the £5M sum announced by the Chancellor of the Exchequer in his recent Budget speech is the sum required to complete funding for the Pier's development, including the swimming pool.
- **Major Naval Exercises.** Ex JOINT WARRIOR 161 will have started by the time that the Council meets in April; increased activity will be evident on the Clyde over the period 7-25 April 2016.
