Item 3b: Guest Speaker2 – Cdr James Leatherby

Report provided ahead of the meeting

- a. **The Armed Forces Covenant**. The AFC still holds but we await the instructions from London as to the future processes that will allow applications for and disbursement of the £10 million pot that the PM announced at the end of last year.
- b. The Argyll & Bute Armed Forces and Communities Partnership. It held its first meeting in March (it will meet twice per year). Its purpose is to work with the Local and other Authorities in education, social care, health, employment and housing to ensure that Service families and Veterans are not being disadvantaged particularly when moving into A&B from other parts of the UK. While it is not aimed at giving Service personnel an advantage, it is intended to ensure that there is a level playing field
- c. **Rhu (Ardenconnel) Playing Fields**. No decision has yet been made as to its future. The information that has been given to the Rhu Gala Day committee has been made in good faith, with the aim of keeping a valuable partner in the community fully and properly informed.
