1.0	Police Report & Matters Arising	Action
	<p>The Police report for May was presented by PC David Charnley, who had taken over the duties of Community Liaison officer for Stonehaven following the retirement of PC Marc Camus</p> <p>There were questions about the increase in anti-social behavior and about whether there were plans to increase policing numbers. DC to report back on the latter.</p> <p>AL proposed a vote of thanks for Marc's diligent service to the community. Agreed by meeting.</p>	

2.0	Member introductions	
	Each member present gave a short introduction about themselves and the interests they wished to pursue as members of SDCC. It was agreed that members should compile a short person spec detailing their experience, skills and interests. This should be sent to the Secretary before the next business meeting.	
3.0	Local Development Plan consultation	
	There was unanimous agreement that SDCC should respond to Aberdeenshire Council, with a view to contributing to the development of the new Local Development Plan. It was agreed speed was essential. PMB suggested local councillors be involved. Cllr Turner said he was happy to be so where possible. A special meeting would be called for 21 st June, so as to consider further.	Action DL
4.0	Resilience Planning:	
	<p>JE reported on proposal for a Local Resilience Plan to be established for Stonehaven. It was proposed that SDCC would “own” the Plan, and would help coordinate the input of other collaborative groups within the town. The Plan would, amongst other things, identify key local risks, contact persons, and the location of centres to be used in an emergency. Emma Storey made clear ownership of plan should be with Community Council. Cllr Black reassured SDCC that a live database of persons at risk is being compiled.</p> <p>The next step was to establish a working group: Phil, Michael and Cllr Turner volunteered to assist.</p>	Action JE

6.1	Public meeting 24th May, at Town Hall: day care services in Stonehaven	
	<p>Aberdeenshire Council had approved the conversion of Invercarron for use for vaccinations (albeit this is to be reviewed annually).</p> <p>Cllr DB reported on a meeting with HSCP staff and all four local Councillors. Case presented as to why Resource Centre was needed for vaccination. All difficulties arising from this decision were presented.</p> <p>HSCP staff emphasised a review would take place in a year. There’ll be mobile vaccination units for areas that are hard to reach. There’ll be supported travel to Vaccination Centres for those who need it. Cllr Turner added to her report</p> <p>RC emphasised how much of a mess these plans are. And how disgraceful the proposals are.</p>	

	<p>Cllr Black underlined how strongly the lack of appropriate alternative accommodation was made clear to HSCP.</p> <p>The Centre's use won't be reviewed until 2023.</p> <p>There was much concerned discussion.</p>	
6.1.1	<p>Priority of the public, attending the public meeting was for the Invercarron Centre to reopen for daycare purposes. It was agreed that SDCC should seek to participate in this annual review process by submitting a Participation Request under the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015.
