1& 2	Chairperson's Welcome and Rollcall	Action
	DL welcomed everyone to the meeting, including those who were	
	attending via Zoom.	
3	Apologies and Declarations of Interest	
	Caroline Duguid (CD), Daniel Veltman (DV), David Charnley, Police	
	Scotland (DC), Donald Lawrie Morrison (DLM), Fiona Tavindale	
	(FT), Janine Esson (JE), Julia Lawrie Morrison (JLM), Norman	
	MacKay (NMcK), Pauline Brindley (PB), Sarah Dickinson (Cllr D),

4	The Library Status	
	DL noted that Live Life Aberdeenshire (LLA) is looking at options for	
	the Library, including a possible relocation to Viewmount. Before any	
	decisions are made LLA must consult with the community. Should	
	the Library relocate, the existing building should be kept for	
	community use. DL has received an e-mail from Aberdeenshire	
	Council Area Manager Tim Stephen (TS), confirming there will be	
	consultation with the community, and highlighting Aberdeenshire	
	Council's policy for making vacant buildings available for community	
	use if possible.	
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	Cllr B has had communication from TS, she suggested working up a business plan for potential use should the Library building become available. She will feed back SDCC's views.	CIIr B
	JS asked if Aberdeenshire Council's Service Centre (at Viewmount) will reopen?	
	Cllr B suggested part of the back of the ground floor at Viewmount might be used to relocate the Library.	
	AL asked that full details of the proposed layout of the relocated Library be included in the consultation, and sought reassurance there will be no loss of current facilities, these should be replaced in full. He also asked for assurance of costs.	
	Cllr T acknowledged lessons have been learned from the change of use of Invercarron Resource Centre (about the need to engage fully with the community).	
	DL noted previous (Aberdeenshire Council) assets had been lost to the community, and asked that there is full and open communication with SDCC on this issue.	
	IH noted there has been no meaningful liaison between SDCC and LLA.	
	MO was concerned about accessibility should the Library relocate.	
	Cllr B confirmed that Viewmont is fully accessible.	
	AL asked for reassurances there will be full public consultation about any changes to the location of the Library. JL suggested approaching LLA again to invite a representative to address a future SDCC meeting, DL agreed to pursue this.	DL
	SMcQ wondered what work needs to be undertaken to the current Library building?	
	JS suggested SDCC writes to Councillors asking them to get a consultation agreed with LLA.	
	Cllr B gave her assurances, on behalf of all elected members, to a public consultation, Cllr T supported this.	
5	Stonehaven Participatory Budgeting - Update	
	DL said work is ongoing at the Leisure Centre, it is due to re-open later in the summer. The project has cost £1.4m, but there is not much change to the building. The multi-use pitch at the Recreation Grounds is almost ready. Work is also underway to reinstate the Putting Green.	

	MO commented there may be an issue with the artificial grass as it can become poisonous due to a chemical reaction to bird guano, and will require regular inspection.	
	Cllr T agreed to ask Stuart Alexander at Aberdeenshire Council about this.	CIIr T
	DL noted the Tennis Club has secured an extension (sic., to the timeframe for spending PB grant) to allow them to apply for additional funding.	
6	Matters Arising from Previous Minutes	
	a) SSEN Kintore -Tealing 400kV Connection and Hurlie (Fetteresso Forest) 400kV Substation – DL advised that SSEN will host a Public Consultation on the Hurlie Substation from 2pm – 7pm, on 13 June, in the Town Hall. Some Community Councillors (CCs) had already met with SSEN, there had been a lack of direct responses to some questions. MO said SSEN do not know where the demand for extra energy will be, and there is no option for sub-sea or underground transmission lines.	
	IH noted some power lines may be underground.	
	DL encouraged as many CCs as possible to attend the Public Consultation. He suggested CCs hold an additional meeting to draft a response to the Consultation (deadline is 23 July), and noted that many decisions are not taken by SSEN but by the Government. The Sherriff Court Building is booked from 7pm on Wednesday 3 July for this meeting.	
	 b) Royal Mail Building – AL confirmed there was no update on this item. 	
	 c) Aberdeenshire Council Updates – Storm Damage Updates (Harbour / Board Walk / Promenade Steps); Redclock Park); Library Opening Hours; Fly Posting. DL said that, following feedback from the previous meeting, this will remain as a standing agenda item for ongoing updates. 	
	d) Community Storage – JS said there will be another meeting in the coming month.	
7	Approval of Previous Minutes (14th May 2024)	
	These were proposed by JS and seconded by AL.	

8	Police Scotland (PS) Report	
	DL had circulated the latest report in advance of the meeting. He	
	noted the number of minor crimes was creeping up, this is a slight	
	concern. PS no longer has resources to attend SDCC meeting in	
	person.	
9	Planning Report	
	DL noted there was a request to change the proposed windfarm.	
	(Number of turbines reduced from 11 to 8.) There are further Public	
	Consultation events at Mackie Academy on 19 June, and the Sherriff Court Building on 20 June. He urged people to attend one of these if	
	possible.	
	JS said this was a great opportunity for the community and local	
	groups to become familiar with the Community Disbursement Fund.	
10	SDCC Committees / Sub-Groups	
10	a) Local Development Plan / Local Place Plan –	
	MO said there was good progress on this, he will send out the	
	documents again, and requested feedback before the next meeting.	MO
	b) Invercarron Resource Centre / Older People's Services –	
	IH has received correspondence from Jane Cruickshank (JC), at The Bellman about a Freedom of Information request, he will follow this	
	up with her. There was uncertainty whether Alzeimers Scotland had	
	withdrawn, or their contract had been cancelled.	
	DL commented this highlighted that the process was flawed.	
	c) Community Resilience Plan –	
	MO confirmed the WhatsApp group had been mobilised (but not	
	needed) in response to all of the winter storms. An electrician will	
	check the minimum requirements for the use of emergency	
	generators, these may be purchased or rented. Once this is	
	complete, the Plan can be finalised. He noted there is no way for the	
	Emergency Services First Responders to contact SDCC.	
	DL agreed it was important to keep communication open as SDCC	
	wants to be able to help if and when required.	
	IH asked if MO has access to other organisations' Resilience Plans?	
	MO confirmed all of the key holders are members of the WhatsApp	
	group.	
	d) Achères & Stonehaven Twinning Partnership –	
	DL said nobody (from SDCC) has volunteered to take this forward,	
	and questioned SDCC's role in the Twinning Partnership, as this needs to be clear. This is not at the stage of a formal	
	partnership/twinning arrangement.	
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	DL said there is a meeting arranged to look at how this event can	
	take place next year.	
11	Outside Bodies / Committees	
	 a) Transport Action Kincardine-shire (TRAK) – IH said the next meeting may be in September. 	
	 b) Town Centre Improvement Group – JS reported that the Group has secured funding for new furniture at 	
	the Craw's Nest. He voiced concern about litter collection along the	
	beachfront, as this is done via voluntary overtime. He asked if Aberdeenshire Council could look at packaging for takeaway food?	
	He noted all the good work Horizon has done.	
	Cllr B clarified that business owners are responsible for a 50m area	
	around their premises, she will raise the issue of litter with the Sub- Licensing Board.	Clir B
