STONEHAVEN TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT REVIEW 2019 – VARIOUS LOCATIONS

1 Reason for Report/Summary

1.1 The reason for this report is to determine new parking restrictions at the identified sites in Stonehaven.

2 Recommendations

The Committee is recommended to -

- 2.1 Authorise the commencement of the statutory procedure for the making of the Aberdeenshire Council (Stonehaven Traffic Management) Order 2019; and
- 2.2 Authorise the subsequent making of the Aberdeenshire Council (Stonehaven Traffic Management) Order 2019 by the Head of Legal and Governance in the event that no valid objections are received, or any received are resolved and withdrawn; and
- 2.3 Instruct the submission of a further report to Committee in the event that any valid objections received are not resolved and not withdrawn, or the proposals are amended following consideration of valid objections.

3 Purpose and Decision Making Route

- 3.1 Towns throughout Aberdeenshire are being reviewed periodically with respect to traffic management requirements as a result of increasing numbers of vehicles and new development. The situation in Stonehaven has been investigated and several measures are proposed to improve traffic management.
- 3.2 Stonehaven and District Community Council and members of the public have raised concerns with regards to visibility at specific junctions within the town and have requested that measures be put in place to alleviate them, those being waiting restrictions. The detail is in **Appendix 1.**
- 3.3 Stonehaven and District Community Council has been advised of the contents of this report.
- 3.4 The Local Members in Ward 18 were consulted on the proposals in this report and at the time had no comments to make.
- 3.5 Police Scotland has been consulted on the contents of this report and it has no comments to make.

4 Discussion

4.1 The proposals, if approved and implemented will result in double yellow line markings being painted at the junctions identified to prohibit vehicles from parking and obscuring the visibility when exiting the junctions. Any vehicle found parked on the parking restrictions will be liable to a fixed penalty issued by Police Scotland.

4.2 Plans showing these proposals are contained in **Appendix 2** to this report. Subject to approval by the Committee, it is proposed to undertake a four week statutory consultation with interested parties. This will be followed by a 21 days public consultation with site notices being erected at the affected location seeking comment from anyone who wishes to make a representation.

5 Council Priorities, Implications and Risk

- 5.2 There are no staffing implications arising from this report.
- 5.3 The cost of implementing the traffic management measures is estimated at £2000 and will be met from the 2019/20 Revenue Works Programme (New Signs, Road Markings and Ancillaries)
