

Community Council Report

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the Kincardine and Mearns Community Council area for the period 1 to 28 February 2019.

The report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to Community Council members and residents you represent. Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, help create safer communities and respond effectively to local concerns.

Community Policing Priorities

Antisocial behaviour, Violence and Disorder:

There continues to be a decrease in the amount of Antisocial Behaviour calls within Kincardine and Mearns.

There were 10 assaults within the February period, which was up by 2 on the previous month. Of those crimes reported 6 are detected and other enquiries are ongoing.

A recent spate of assaults that have taken place within or immediately outside Licenced premises has seen 8 offenders added to Pubwatch with various durations of banning applied.

Acquisitive Crime:

For the month of February 2019, there have been 7 thefts in the Kincardine and Mearns area. This is 11 less than the last report, of which 2 are detected, 5 are still under investigation.

There has been 1 Housebreaking to a commercial premises (Pallet Company at Fourdon),1 Housebreaking to domestic premises with a positive line of enquiry being followed, and no thefts from motor vehicles during the last months.

Road Safety & road crime:

Drink Driving

In February 2019 there were 2 reported drink drivers, 1 reported to the Procurator Fiscal and 1 under enquiry.

Careless Driving

In February 2019, 2 reports were submitted to the Procurator Fiscal for consideration of prosecution, and 1 other remains undetected.

There were also 2 offences relating to driving whilst under the influence of drugs, 1 has been reported and the other has a line of enquiry.

K&M officers have been involved in Operation Cedar. The identification of Road Traffic Offenders.

Over the period 4 Fixed penalties for Double Yellow Line offences, 2 for Zig-zag (white line) offences and numerous Speed checks conducted outside Newtonhill Primary, Durris Primary, Woodlands Primary, Mackie Academy, Dunnottar Primary, Mill o' Forest Primary, St Cyrus Primary and Arduthie Primary schools.

2 speeding tickets issues at Riverside of Blairs for excessive speed in 30mph zone.

Numerous drivers educated and warned regarding driving standards.

Residents in the areas affected by antisocial driving or any suspicious activities are encouraged to contact Police on 101 at the time to report incidents in order for us to take positive action.

Community Engagement & Reassurance

PC Camus has lead a Safer Schools Initiative to promote safer driving in proximity to schools. As part of the Initiative he's been sourcing banners, working with pupils to raise awareness of road safety in conjunction with Aberdeenshire Council and the Community Councils.

Further to the complaints raised regarding parking issues in Market Square, Stonehaven all businesses are reminded that they are not exempt from fines for overstaying the parking restrictions.
