# FROM THE CLERGY TEAM

A new journey, back to where it all started! As many of you will know Matt and I have now moved to Charlton-on-Otmoor and I am very excited to still be with the Benefice, where for me the whole journey to faith started. It started in Charlton 26 years ago with a knock on the door from the deacon, Judith Mount. It doesn't seem that long ago I told her I would come to church once and if I didn't like it I would not come again. Well, who said God doesn't have a sense of humour!!! On the 2nd of October I will be licenced in that same church and living in the very house Judith lived in!

Over the years there have been frustrations and challenges but these feelings have been outnumbered by the blessing I have received from the wonderful people in our churches with whom I have worshiped and worked.

Since my ordination I have baptised babies that cry, babies who have slept through the whole event, twins, and I have even christened a father and daughter in the same service. What a joy! Baptism is such a wonderful occasion in which the child or adult is welcomed and received into the church and it is the start of a wonderful journey with God.

I have officiated at weddings which are such a blessing and I can't wait to see what everyone will be wearing and how imaginative they have been in their planning. I have had brides who have arrived by horse and carriage and in vintage motors - even one in an old fire engine. These days are joyous days and sometimes the weather plays ball and sometimes it does not, but that doesn't matter. It is a time of prayer and support for the couple as they start their

new journey together.

Funerals are always a real honour to officiate at, and you find that people have lead such interesting lives as the family share details about their loved one with the congregation. For Jesus came to tell us about eternal life and gave his life so that we may receive it. So death is not the end from a Christian perspective but a new beginning.

I have been a chaplain in the local prisons and also with the Army - both of which I enjoyed even if they are both very different.

When you decide to 'climb on board with the Lord' you may appear to have gone around in a full circle, as I have, right back to the very place I started but it has never been dull and always a lot of fun.

I am looking forward to carrying on my journey within the Benefice I love and that I believe God has called me to. For with God ever increasing circles are possible.

I offer the same invite that Judith did all those years ago if you are not a regular church-goer: come along and see for yourself what a life in Christ is all about. I can guarantee you that life will never be the same. For it is never where you start but where you finish that is important. I am looking forward to God saying one day "You have reached your final destination"

## CHILDRENS POSTER COMPITITION, BAG IT AND BIN IT

In conjunction with Five Acres School, the Parish Council will be launching a poster competition for all school children under the age of 12 who live in the village or go to Five Acres School, to create the best poster combatting dog waste around the village. The posters will be placed around the village, and the winners will also be able to name the dog waste bins. Here are a few ideas for starters - Richard The Third, and Doggy McDogFace. Remember, there is up to a fine of £1000 if you are caught dog fouling.

#### FLYTIPPING AND POTHOLES

Broken Street Lights, Pot Holes and Fly tipping and overgrowing hedges obstructing footways, along with many other highways issues can be reported direct to the County and District Councils, via http://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Following from concerns raised by some residents about crime in the village, the Parish Council is still seeking volunteers for Neighbourhood Watch. We have a number of people who are interested in becoming coordinators, but require additional volunteers. Please contact the Parish Clerk.

#### FIVE ACRES - CHICKENS

The new chick run has been installed in a new location at Five Acres school, the parents of the school are to be congratulated for their fund raising efforts and the Parish Council was delighted to make a modest donation to assist.

#### FIVE ACRES - PLAY AREAS

The Parish Council has agreed to provide a grant to the Five Acres School, assist in the replacement and repair of play areas to the nursery. This funding will also be matched from our County Councillor's annual fund, however this work is now being delayed until the proposals for the new classrooms at Five Acres are finalised.

#### **HIGHWAYS**

The Parish Council is awaiting a meeting with the County Council Highways Team, in relation to the proposals to replace the railings on the north side of Ploughley Road, the state of Merton Road, grit bins for Ambrosden Court and Springfields, speed surveys and to install a piece of missing footpath on Merton Road by the bus stop.

Due to the level of complaints about vehicles driving along the footway on Ploughley Road adjacent the school, it is proposed to install bollards in the footway, and residents will be encouraged to apply for dropped kerbs to achieve direct access to their properties where required.

It is an offence under Section 72 of the Highway Act to drive along the footway, and residents of Ploughley Road have previously received letters from the Community Police Officers about this issue

#### LITTER

A new litter bin with additional recycling has been ordered to be located near the village shop. The existing litter bin will be repositioned next to Park Rise to replace the damaged litter bin.

### OXFORD TO CAMBRIDGE EXPRESS WAY

The proposals for the east west express way previously promoted as the Euro Route from Southampton to Felixstow in the early 1990's have been revived, and Oxford to Milton Keynes is now the missing link in the route between the A43 and the A421 dual carriageway which starts at M1 J13.

While Otmoor has now been saved, the route options include the Ray Valley which could hugely impact on the environmentally sensitive Ray Valley and villages. All local Parish Councils will be meeting at the beginning of October to see how we can work together.

REPORT FROM ARNCOTT VHMC & ACA MEETING 28th AUGUST & PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 4th SEPTEMBER 2018

#### Closure of Ploughley Road

OCC have advised the parish council that the Ploughley Road from Ambrosden to Lower Arncott / Palmer Avenue roundabout will be closed from October 6th to October 10th so that micro-asphalt surfacing work can be done to the road. The detour route advised to get to Ambrosden / Bicester is along Palmer Avenue, turn left onto the B4011 Thame Road, turn left into Ambrosden, drive past the bottom entrance to Five Acres School and turn right at the junction. Limited access will be maintained for emergency vehicles and for frontages within the closed section of the road subject to the progress of the works.

### Woodpiece Road parking

No further updates have been received from CDC. As previously mentioned, the phase 1 work is likely to commence sometime during the financial year 2019 / 2020.

#### **Defibrillator Units**

There are two public defibrillator units within the village. One unit is fitted to the village hall outer wall facing Murcott Road – cabinet ID number AR84. The other unit is fitted at The Tally Ho Hotel and is located on the building end wall in line with the hotel car park entrance – cabinet ID number AR82. To gain access to either unit dial 999 and speak

with the ambulance service. The call desk operator will decide if the use of a defibrillator is necessary. If asked for then tell the call desk operator the ID number on the cabinet door. You will then be given the code number to open that door.

Grant money for sports facilities
The parish council has written to CDC to ask
if the grant money can be used to provide a
new building next to the village hall and, if
yes, would planning permission be required.
The new building would provide additional
storage and changing room facilities. The
parish council is waiting for CDC to reply.

The community play bus visits our village on Tuesdays between 1:00pm and 2:30pm. The bus parks up next to the village hall and offers free play and support sessions / stay & play for children aged up to 5 years old along with parents and carers.

Village Hall public address system This project is ongoing and best options and costs are still being explored.

#### Seats

The seat in the corner of the village green next to Green lane has been repaired. Options to replace the two broken seats at the playing are being explored.

#### Football field fencing

At this time, the installation of concrete bollards from the end of the village hall playground to the back fences of the gardens in Hopcraft Close looks to be a viable option. The parish council is currently awaiting for an additional quote for this work.

News from the Woodland Group – What does the Fortnightly Working Party actually do? Volunteers have been working hard to improve the Woodland, both as habitats for wildlife, and as a lovely sanctuary for families, walkers and riders to enjoy.

Green hay has been put down in the meadow, which is full of meadow flower seeds. By next Spring / Summer this whole section should be jostling with native species, both beautiful to look at, and valuable as a habitat for native wildlife species.

Traditional country crafts are used to manage the Woodland – volunteers have become expert at weaving willow and coppicing hazel to make hedges. If you'd like to learn how to do either of these yourself, the Volunteers would be happy to show you.

Taming the Blackthorn hedges. Blackthorn has been used for thousands of years for making hedges – principally because it has really vicious thorns.

To manage the blackthorn hedge which has grown and fallen across the ride, the Woodland

Woodland Volunteers have called in the Vale Conservation Volunteers. These hardy types have power tools and chain saws to enable them to lay a new hedge. Once this is done, the ride will be passable again, and we'll have created a new breeding habitat for the local, rare Brown Harestreak butterflies.

Picnic benches. People love using the Woodland in the Spring and Summer for picnics. We're planning 2 large new picnic benches – make sure you use them once they're installed. (Please do make sure you take your rubbish home with you...most people are very respectful, and thank you to you, but a few leave litter, which is horrible.)

New volunteers. The Woodland Volunteers could always use more people to help maintain and develop this beautiful, tranquil area. Whether you are an experienced gardener, or would just like to meet people and learn new skills, the Volunteers would love to talk to you. Horse Riders, Cyclists and the Ambrosden Straight

Anyone who lives in Merton is used to the sight of the horses riding between the stables and the Woodland. (Very) many cyclists also pass through the village.

By the same token, anyone who lives in Merton is used to the very high speeds that many people reach when driving down the Ambrosden Straight. The problems arise on the sharp bends just as you come into Merton. It's simply impossible to see if there are horses (or bikes) either coming into, or out of the village. Even if a car has braked to slow down for the corner, they're not driving at a speed at which it is safe to overtake horses — it is recommended that 10-15mph is a safe maximum. It's also quite a narrow section of road, and, if horses are there,

the only way to avoid them is by swerving out into the path of oncoming traffic.

The Ambrosden Straight is a lovely, long, straight piece of road, with very satisfying bumps. It's all too easy (and pleasurable) to go for it – particularly if you've been stuck in Bicester's endless traffic jams. But the Merton right hand turn really is dangerous, both for horses and bikes – and for any car driver who causes an accident.

Keep yourself, horses and cyclists safe by slowing right down in time for the sharp corner.

Oxford – Cambridge Expressway: Hot off the press (at time of publication)

The chosen route of the corridor has been announced as Route B. However, the specifics of the route have yet to be clarified. However, Transport minister Jesse Norman said: "The preferred route rules out construction in the area of the Otmoor nature reserve, demonstrating the Government's "desire to protect the natural environment"

This sounds as if they will not be bulldozing the route right across Otmoor itself.

The risk to area as a whole remains grave, however, and we need to keep on applying what pressure we can, via our elected political representatives, and other campaigning bodies. Further to this, can I recommend a Guardian article from 22nd August written by George Monbiot. He highlights the huge changes the Expressway will make, without any meaningful discussion or consultation. If you'd like to read it, the link is:

APPEAL AGAINST PLANNING APPLICATION 17/01962/F GYPSY/ TRAVELLER SITE ON WIDNELL LANE

An appeal against the decision made by Cherwell's planning committee to refuse the above application has been received. Piddington Parish Council intend to work closely with the Cherwell team and will attend the inquiry. Councillors agreed that the village will need legal representation and a fighting fund has once again been set up for donations towards these costs which are likely to be in excess of £10,000. Can you help? If so, please contact our clerk Anne Davies directly. (piddington.parish.clerk@googlemail.com). All donations will remain anonymous. parish council will also announce the date for a village meeting once discussions have been held between themselves and Cherwell

In the meantime villagers can show support by writing to the inspector directly confirming their original concerns. An online appeals service is available for comments that can be found through the Appeals Casework Portal (https://acp.planninginspectorate.gov.uk). Alternatively, you can write to the Planning Inspectorate, 3/26 Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol, BS1 6PN quoting the appeal reference number APP/C3105/W/18/3209349. Submissions must be received by 16th October at the latest.

#### OXFORD – CAMBRIDGE EXPRESSWAY

The government has now announced their chosen corridor for the expressway which is Corridor B. The area in question is huge and a number of routes will now be considered particularly whether the road should go west or south of Oxford and west or east of Bicester. A booklet has been published by Highways England which can be found on their website (http://assets. highwaysengland.co.uk/roads/road-projects/Oxford+to+Cambridge+expressway/Oxford+to+Cambridge+Expressway+Corridor+overview+booklet.pdf).

It has been confirmed that the Otmoor nature reserve will not be considered. It is the parish council's understanding that Highways England will now start a 12-month program of 'on the ground' studies of potential routes (and from this the accommodation of 300,000 more homes in Oxfordshire) which they will take into a Public Consultation in late 2019. A meeting will be held at the Community Hall in Charlton on Otmoor School on 3rd October for all parish councils likely to be affected by the decision which PPC will be attending. Momentum is also growing for a 'no road' option. Please see the No Expressway Alliance website for more information http://www.noexpresswayalliance. org/.

#### SEVEN STARS PUBLIC HOUSE

PPC have been advised that the appeal against the ACV on the pub was not successful and that it will remain on the building for the next 5 years. It was concluded that there was

sufficient evidence to suggest that the pub has had and would have an important part to play in village life had it remained open. The owner of the property has the right to appeal the decision.

# ROAD-CALMING MEASURES FOR THE VILLAGE

The Vehicle Activated Sign on the Arncott Road has been running for a month and data has been collected for vehicle movements in and out of the village (incoming vehicles 2019 and outgoing 1814). Most vehicles are entering and leaving the village at less than 30mph (78% and 70% respectively). However, 9 vehicles were detected entering the village and 23 vehicles exited doing speeds of 45-65+mph with one exiting at 79mph!! It is early days and the team are likely to revise some of the measuring parameters as they get to know the system better. The VAS will be moved to an alternative site later in the month.

### VET'S REPORT

The Changing Face of Bicester Vets

When I first joined the vet practice in 1995 it was a 5 vet mixed practice meaning that, in the style of James Herriot, we dealt with all domestic animals. This included sheep & cattle including some thriving dairy farms. We visited equines

ranging from Shetland ponies to high performance hunters. And of course, we dealt with what is termed small animals; dogs, cats, rabbits, gerbils and anything else small enough to bring in to the practice.

Over time the style of farming changed with the times. More and more the land was used for arable crops and the small dairy herds sold their "quota"

of milk production allowance to larger dairies seeking to expand their businesses. Along with this, the developments in veterinary medicine and the expectations of owners increased at a pace. Television shows like "Vets in Practice" and now "The Supervet" have opened the doors and shown behind the scenes at busy practices and have given Veterinary practice a generally positive exposure to the public.

So, in the mid noughties the time came for Bicester Vets to narrow their focus onto what was becoming the major part of our workload – Small Animals. The decision to stop seeing farm animals & horses was difficult but made good sense. We knew that there were other

more specialised practices who would quickly take on that work & so, Bicester Vets became a specialist small animal practice.

This has enabled us to offer a far better service to our clients and their pets. We now have 11 Vets operating out of our original site which is now an RCVS Accredited Small Animal Hospital.


We still provide our own after hours cover with a nurse on site overnight to care for inpatients and a Vet on call 24/7. We continue to invest in equipment and training and now offer keyhole surgery for bitch spays, laser therapy for injuries and sore joints, as well as ultrasound imaging and rapid turnaround blood testing in house. We are about to start using our 2 brand new consulting rooms which will give us some valuable


extra space to alleviate waiting times and improve the client experience at Bicester Vets.




