Throughout the benefice we have celebrated Harvest in style. We have pressed apples and made apple juice and cider, we have had quiz nights, we have built a pyramid of tins, we have had a scarecrow competition, we have held auctions and we have had harvest lunches and suppers. And that's not to mention the harvest services we have enjoyed.

Thank you to everyone who has helped decorate our churches and to everyone who has contributed towards the services and harvest collections. We will be taking a van load of goodies to the Bicester Foodbank (including over 200 tins!) and have taken the opportunity to express our thanks to God for His provision by sharing His generosity with others in need. We have also celebrated Lisa's licensing as a house for duty priest to the benefice this month. Lisa is well known to many of us and has lived in the area and served on the team for a number of years. She and Matt have moved into Charlton-on Otmoor and we look forward to her ministry thriving as she takes on this new role.

That means that our team is now comprised of myself as rector, Lucy and Lisa as house for duty priests, Glenys as a licensed lay minister and Lynne as our administrator. Between us we are able to lead our 30 regular services each month across the benefice as well as provide services for baptisms, weddings and funerals. Visiting the schools and arranging pastoral visits complete pretty busy timetables but we try to be as available as possible across

the parishes.

Christmas is on the horizon but before that we have our Remembrance services where we have the opportunity to remember those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice for us. This year marks the 100th year since Armistice Day and there will be bell ringing and exhibitions to mark that occasion. At Ambrosden we have 5 silhouette figures which are placed in the pews – outline reminders that we wouldn't be enjoying the lives we do today had brave men and women not served in our armed forces.

Harvest reminds us that we have a debt to God and a resulting responsibility. Remembrance Day reminds us that we have a debt of gratitude to those who have served in the past and those who serve today. All Souls' Day is an opportunity to remember those who have gone before us and left us such a legacy. GLADMAN – PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT OF 85 HOUSES IN MERTON ROAD

Residents have requested that villagers do not respond developers questionnaire, as this will give the developer the opportunity to rebut any claims that this development has no impact on the setting of the village.

FIVE ACRES SCHOOL

The Parish Council is highly supportive of the emerging proposals to replace the portacabins with two new permanent class rooms. This will cause a small amount of disruption while being built, but will significantly improve the quality of the school buildings, but will not increase the capacity of the school.

HIGHWAYS

The Parish Council is awaiting a meeting with the County Council Highways Team, in relation to the proposals to replace the railings on the north side of Ploughley Road, the state of Merton Road, grit bins for Ambrosden Court and Springfields, speed surveys and to install a piece of missing footpath on Merton Road by the bus stop.

The Parish Council is also considering in detail a proposal to install a number of Speed Activated signs around the village and adjacent the school.

The Parish Council has also had some initial conversations with the Highways Department about lowering the speed limit to 20mph. We are advise that this might be possible in Merton Road, but not Ploughley Road.

The damaged litter bin at the entrance to Park Rise has been replaced.

Green Lane / Village Green The majority of the wooden posts on the village green next to Green Lane are loose and need removing. The parish council would like your opinion as to whether you think the posts should just be removed and not replaced or, if your opinion is that they be replaced with something, please let us know what you think that something should be.

Defibrillator Units

Two public defibrillator units are within the village. One unit is fitted to the village hall outer wall facing Murcott Road – ID number AR84. The other unit is fitted at The Tally Ho Hotel and is located on the building end wall in line with the hotel car park entrance – ID number AR82. To gain access to either unit dial 999 and speak with the ambulance service. The call desk operator will decide if the use of a defibrillator is necessary. If asked for then tell the call desk operator the ID number on the cabinet door. You will then be given the code number to open that door.

Grant money for sports facilities
No reply from CDC has yet been received
with regard to the parish council asking if the
grant money can be used to provide a new
building next to the village hall and, if yes,
would planning permission be required. The
parish clerk has been asked to contact CDC
yet again for its response.

Community emergency response
To date, it appears that no-one is interested
in this initiative. If you decide that you want
to be involved with this then please let us
know by emailing the parish clerk or the
parish email address. Again, due to GDPR
regulations, the parish council will need your
permission in writing for your contact details
to be kept on record.

Village Hall public address system This project is ongoing. A meeting with a possible supplier will be arranged to discuss the most suitable option(s).

Speeding

It's been reported that some vehicles leaving / entering Upper Arncott are speeding as they approach / go through the new Murcott Road build out. Volunteers are needed to record the details of these vehicles. This info can be passed onto the police. To get involved with a speedwatch program contact the parish clerk or any parish councillor. Due to GDPR regulations, the parish council will need your permission in writing for your contact details to be kept on record.

The parish council has no legal power(s) to deal with this. We can only reiterate previous advice – whenever possible, get witness statements, take photographs and / or record video of the behaviour and report it to the police.

Healthwatch Oxfordshire

The Parish Council has received its monthly briefing from Healthwatch for Oxfordshire

You might not have heard of Healthwatch, but they actually have quite a lot of clout.

They are the county's health and social care watchdog. They collect your opinions and experiences and use them to inform and influence those who run your health and social care services

Share your thoughts and experiences of any health or social care services with them. Your ideas may genuinely be passed on to the people with the power in the NHS and social care within Oxfordshire

Latest CQC reports published

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) has published its latest round of inspection reports, including several Oxfordshire care providers. If you're looking for up to date reports on the services available to you and yours, this is a good place to start.

New open visiting hours at Oxford hospitals Oxford University Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust has introduced a new open visiting policy. The new visiting hours at the Trust's hospitals will be from 10.00am until 10.00pm, except for critical care and high dependency units.

The Police are offering support for sex assault victims by launching new a new SARC in Bicester

SARC stands for Sexual Assault Referral Centres (SARC).

This new Bicester SARC provides a discreet and confidential service to survivors of sexual assault and abuse. Support is available twentyfour hours a day, seven days a week. Clients can access health and forensic medical services, as well as crisis support.

The service employs specially trained doctors and crisis workers to care for clients and, if the client wishes to report the assault to the police, they can arrange for an informal talk with a specially trained police officer.

It contains lots of useful information about what to expect, and practical information on aspects such as how to get home, what support is available, and who will be involved. Flu vaccination campaign launched by the NHS The annual flu vaccination campaign has been launched in Oxfordshire and people are being invited to get their vaccination against the virus.

Here's some information from the Islip GPs' surgery:

The Islip Medical Practice is hoping to keep

everyone well this winter, so we're offering the seasonal Flu vaccine to anyone who is eligible.

If you fall into any of the "high priority" categories outlined below, the Surgery would like to encourage you to make an appointment as soon as possible.

High priority people include anyone who is:

- 1. Aged over 65
- 2. Aged under 65 in a clinical risk group (such as asthma, cancer patients)
- 3. Carers
- 4. Healthcare workers

Flu vaccination clinics are being held on Saturday 3rd November from 9.30 until 12.00.

There are also other week day dates available in October if you can't make one of these dates. Please telephone the Surgery on 01865 371666 as soon as possible to make your appointment. (Appointments for flu vaccinations are not available via the on-line appointment service). If you are eligible for the jab but don't want to take the offer up, we'd be grateful if you could let the Surgery know. This will help us by save time in issuing reminders, and stop us bothering you unnecessarily.

VET'S REPORT

Hock Fracture for Akira

When Akira popped through the cat flap on

Saturday night his owner, Chris, spotted a major problem with his back leg which was dragging behind him. Chris went upstairs to call Bicester Vets but before he knew it, Akira was behind him as if nothing was wrong. He had climbed up the stairs on three legs and was behaving as normal.

At the surgery, Vet Kyra quickly spotted that Akira's right hock was dramatically out of alignment – (the hock is the equivalent of our ankle). X-rays showed that the bottom end of the tibia (or shin bone) had detached from the bone, presumably due to a car accident or a bad fall.

The important thing for now was to ensure our patient was comfortable for the weekend and that nothing else was damaged. So, on Monday morning, Kyra and I set about putting his leg back together and fixing it back in place so that the bone could heal again. The broken piece of bone was only a few mm thick and difficult to get purchase on. So, to ensure a solid repair, a pin was driven down the middle of the tibia and through the broken

piece which was now back in place. For added strength the pin was pushed through the other bones of the hock to temporarily fix it all in position whilst the fracture heals. (See the xrays

- before & after)

Within hours of the surgery Akira was awake and asking for food. His bandaged leg seemed to cause him little concern and we expect him to go home to start his crate rest in another day's time.

We have a period ahead of us where the owner needs to ensure Akira doesn't run upstairs or try jumping onto window sills or worktops. We'll take the support bandage off after a week or so. It should be a straightforward matter to remove the pin after a follow up x-ray in 2 months' time. We then can start some physio to return movement to the joint.

Hopefully, Akira will be back on the window sills by Christmas when his accident and surgery should be a distant memory.







Ps Young animals have areas in their main leg bones called growth plates. Growth plates allow for rapid lengthening of the bones during growth and these don't fully calcify until the skeleton is mature. Before

then, the growth plates can act as a weakness and that is where Akira's bone fractured.


