1	Chairman's Welcome	
	Ronald welcomed everyone to the meeting.	
	Apologies were received from Vivienne Plampton, Paige Shepherd

2	Approval of previous minutes	
2.1	The minutes were approved Proposed: Anne Short Seconded: Gabriele Pearson	
3	Youth issues	
3.1	Jeremy read the report from Wanda MacKay:	
3.2	<ol> <li>All activities and clubs are running as normal and doing well</li> <li>Two Cromarty Girls attended a weekend away with Youth Highland on a Youth Participation Project</li> <li>Many young Cromarty people are now taking part in volunteering and are working towards their Saltire Award</li> <li>Juniors and seniors enjoyed some Easter activities in Cromarty as well as a hunt and competition</li> <li>Fraser supported Eco Day in Cromarty Primary School. The whole school took part in this exciting day</li> </ol>	

4	Police Report	
4.1	There was no police representative present and no report had been received.	
4.2	Gabriele said she had spoken to Sergeant McNeil and asked that if he did not attend the meeting to send some statistics for members' information but nothing has been forthcoming.	
5	Matters arising from previous minutes	
5.1	(5.2 – Lights on multi-court) – no action as yet	PS
5.2	(5.3 – catch on gates on Links) Ronald had still to complete the work.	RY
5.3	(5.10 – dog bin for Burnside) There are three broken at present. Still awaiting the installation of the new bin at Burnside.	
5.4	(5.11 – Seaplane Plinth Fund) Vivienne has received a response from John Nightingale which says he is happy to see this sum held in abeyance for another project. Alternatively, he will consider the overhaul of Kirkie Brae once there is a clearer indication of costs. David added that this year was the 100 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Seaplane Base and the first round Britain seaplane flight. He said there would be an event in the Cromarty Firth on 22 <sup>nd</sup> August to commemorate these and perhaps a plaque or similar could be commissioned. He asked if this could be kept in the mix as there was possibly something this money could fund in relation to the seaplanes. This will be kept on the agenda.	
5.5	(5.13 – meeting with dog warden) Craig is meeting Nell this Friday. Ronald reiterated that we'd reported some owners, including one actually caught on video not clearing up the dog mess but no action had yet been taken. Braehead corner and the Links were still bad. David said that Grantown had used the spraypaint option possibly funded through the Green Dog Walking scheme.	
5.6	(5.17 – Bobby's tractor) Craig has yet to speak with David about options under the Communities Scheme. David said there was still an option to bid to the Challenge Fund if there was work that could be taken from the council and undertaken locally.	
5.7	(7.1 – potholes in roads in town) Some had been done but after further approaches, lan Hay had said he'd look again at those apparently missed.	
6	Gaelic Chapel	
6.1	Craig said there was nothing to report from the update at the last meeting.	

7	Review and update on Councillors' portfolios	
7.1	Anne said she'd met with Ricky McNabb, Ewan Marsh and one other. She was greatly encouraged by the enthusiasm they showed at the meeting and had supplied her with a complete list of information about service level agreements for ground maintenance, street cleaning, public conveniences and schools ground maintenance. It was exactly the information members had been after and there was a comprehensive pack including very detailed maps available for all to see. These will be circulated to members.	
7.2	There was a meeting at the football field to discuss the maintenance there.	
7.3	Anne said that we now know precisely what should be done and can monitor the activity and efficiency of the contractors.	
8	Victoria Hall report	
8.1	There was no Victoria Hall report on this occasion.	
9	<u>Treasurer's report</u>	
9.1	Vivienne had circulated, prior to the meeting, a draft report for the AGM which all members were happy with.	
10	Highland Councillors' reports	
10.1	Craig reported that the trees at the viewpoint were still obstructing the view and he'd speak with Gail Pocock to see if they could be trimmed.	
10.2	Craig was after some duck warning signs for the top of Denny Road.	
10.3	The Smithy had offered to supply a grating to replace the slab at the end of the Ladies' Walk.	
10.4	He said two benches near the lighthouse needed replacing and was following that up.	
10.5	Craig also reported on an awareness-raising campaign he was supporting in relation to the dangers of fishing litter (for example, balls of fishing line) which could injure and kill animals.	
10.6	Craig also said the beach clean was about to take place and gave details of the day.	
10.7	Craig said he'd sent a reminder about the fence around Victoria Park.	
10.8	David said that the District Partnership would take place on Friday and the subject was Health and Social Care.	
11	Correspondence	
11.1	The letter about the Seaplane Fund was dealt with under Treasurer's report.	

12	Davidston wind turbines appeal	
12.1	Gabriele said that she wanted to minute the decision to resubmit the results of the questionnaire in Cromarty to the appeal that was taking place in relation to the planning application.	
12.2	The site visit by the inspector will be on Tuesday the 21 of May, 9.30am at Canon Street Davidston.	
13	Any other business	
13.1	Anne raised the subject of untaxed vehicles, apparently abandoned vehicles and another caravan that had appeared on the shore front. She said some parts of the town looked like a dumping ground for boats and vehicles of all sorts.	
13.2	Ronald said that there were two broken windows on 'Nancy's Shelter' and asked if the £70-80 to repair them could come from the Ward budget. He would ask Di Agnew if this could be done.	RY
13.3	He also asked if the Common Good Fund money issues had been bottomed out. David said this was still no further forward.	
13.4	The member of public present asked about the trees around the workshop west of White Dykes and the fact they were causing dampness. She asked if they could be cut down or some branches removed. Ronald said to contact the land owner and David said to write to Housing and Property at HC to say what the issue was. It was agreed that she would contact Bill Campbell, the owner, in the first instance to see if it could be resolved straight away.	
13.5	Gabriele said the Cromarty Firth Stakeholders meeting agenda had been received and Ronald asked for details to be emailed to him.
