Appendix A Agenda item 5

POLICE REPORT 27/09/16 to 30/10/16.

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From the 27th of September to the 30th of October police dealt with 21 calls to the Cromarty area. The nature of these calls included assistance/advice calls, abandoned vehicles, alarm activations, medical matters and child protection issues. During this period there was only one reported theft from the Cromarty area and enquiries into this are ongoing with an indication that it may have actually occurred outwith the Cromarty area. Please be aware that as of the 3rd of October parking enforcement in the Highland area has been de-criminalised and will now be dealt with by Highland Council wardens based at Faraline Park, Inverness. Police Scotland will still be responsible for criminal offences across all Highland Roads, such as Obstruction or Dangerous Parking and Blue Badge misuse. The Highland Council will also receive increased powers to uplift vehicles. Further details on the changes can be found on the Highland Council website. Essentially this means that any issues you have in relation to unauthorised parking or parking issues should be routed through the Highland Council and not the police as it is now their responsibility to deal with the matter. If you make a complaint to the Highland Council they should dispatch some of their wardens to address the matter and carry out periods of enforcement if and when required.

Apparently someone has been appointed to deal with the renewal in the HC Legal team. We have been advised to upgrade the Licence to cover the next 50 years, rather than just 6. We have submitted the request and await news! Highland Council repairs to the Hall are still outstanding! YES, SO THERE HAS BEEN BARELY ANY CHANGE!

3. Emergency Resilience Project All works have now been completed, including the outstanding electrical work and extensive groundworks. In addition, the Victoria Hall's defibrillator has also been fitted, and is operational. It is hoped that dress rehearsals and training sessions, for the Victoria Hall's part of the Emergency Action Plan, will commence after 7th November. The Fire Service has also supplied their advice. The snow plough has been returned, after service, and is in its new home. Final supplies of diesel and lpg need to be purchased, but I am confident that next month's report will show that the Project has been completed within budget. It looks like we are getting ready for winter!

Cromarty Primary School	I am in the Primary school for 40 weeks of the year for 2 hour each week additional to this I supported with the delivery of resilient kids to 11 P7s for 8 weeks I delivered 8 hour bike ability sessions to 11 P4s - P7s 20 weeks of Football at lunchtime and golden time 15 people at each session I worked with the whole school (60 Pupil) at 3 Eco Days, these were7 hour days Supporting the Christmas Fare 1 day event - 7 hours			
Mountain Biking	This runs on a Tuesday night 7 - 8.30pm for 45 weeks of the year. 6 young people have been attending mountain biking sessions with various biking days out at the weekends throughout the year. BI Mountain Bike Club deliver the mountain biking but I support.

Badminton	This class ran for 15 weeks on a Tuesday at 4.15 - 5.15 pm with 6 - 10 people turning up each week, this class was supported by Fraser but is run by a young volunteer.
Sailing	This runs on a Tuesday night from 5.30pm - 9pm this ran for 16 week this year, 23 young people have had the chance to take part in sailing, if sailing wasn't an option due to boat troubles Simon would offer to take the young people out on the RIB or Kayaking. Sailing is delivered by Simon but I support every Tuesday.
Tennis coaching	On a Saturday morning from 9am - 12noon for weeks tennis coaching was delivered to 30 young people.
Employability	Each week I support 1 young person for 1 hour at a time to help them to reach a positive destination by helping with them to build a CV's enabling them to apply for jobs I have worked with 15 different young people aged 16 - 25 to help them into employment.
Volunteers	On a Monday for 40 weeks of the year there can be up to 16 young people volunteering at Cromarty Junior Youth Café, supporting young people and deliver activities to them I supported 1 young girl for 5 weeks for 1 hour per week to help her into employment; I spoke to an organisation called Plan b to organise for her to attend sessions with them doing photography During the festive period I have support various families with meals from the Highland Homeless Trust ensuring that families don't have to choose whether to heat their home or eat I did 3 food drops to 40 families and older folk In the community. 3 Families receive Christmas present donations from MFR Cash for Kids I collected these presents and the delivered to the families.
Christmas Party	Each year I host a Christmas party for 2 hours for all young people aged 2 - 18 to attend at the last Christmas party 60 young people turned up.
Holiday programmes	During each school holiday I offer young people a range of activities to take part in

Some days were longer than others. During the holidays programme all of the young people that are counted above are from Cromarty
Bonfire Night	In the Youth Café I support the young people for 2 hour once a year to create the guy for the top of the bonfire. On bonfire night I support young people at stalls to raise funds to local community groups I do this for 3 hours per year.

- 2 young lads and one girl are on the Skiff Committee, they have attended 4 meeting that were an hour long and have attended 2 sessions to help build the skiff these sessions were 4 hours long.
- 2 young lads who volunteer at Cromarty Youth Café, they received the opportunity to attend a 5 day voyage with Ocean Youth Trust for all of their hard work volunteering.
- Wanda and I were invited to Holyrood to have Tea in the Garden with the Queen for all of our hard work on The Black Isle.
- I attended a forum consultation event with Henry Simmons, Chief Executive of Alzheimer Scotland we were given a presentation on the work of Alzheimer Scotland, There policy ambitions and visions, challenges and opportunities. This was followed by an open forum discussion where I had the opportunity to ask questions.
