Cromarty Aid for Guyana

Sandy Thomson writes:

Towards the end of 2020 just over £4,000 was collected locally and transferred to All Saints Presbyterian Church in New Amsterdam, Guyana.

This funded the renovation of a kitchen in the church's Development Centre so that free school lunches could be provided for local children.

The impetus for the fundraising was the growing understanding of the historic links between Guyana and the highlands of Scotland based on highland ownership of slave plantations there.

The Rev. Dr. Selby Ross at All Saints has now asked us if we could help some more. The church needs to repair the back and side walls of the Development Centre, replacing the wooden structure with a concrete one.

Cromarty Peace Group is promoting three events over the festive period to raise money for this project. These are: Wednesday 21st December: Carols by Candlelight, St. Regulus Church, Cromarty

Friday/Saturday 6/7th. January: Two House Concerts at Barkly House, Cromarty.

Saturday 14th. January: Quiz Night in the Fishertown Inn, Cromarty.

Cromarty Community Development Trust

Constructing Cromarty Community Campsite

The tenders are out for pricing by the contractors over December 2022. Funds permitting, we will be able to commission the full scope of works, in a single phase. To this end CCDT secured a further £40K grant for the campsite in June 2022. It was awarded, as an uplift, to take account of the rapid inflation and the changing economic climate currently affecting construction works.

With a clear scope of works, the remainder of the tree cutting commission - which was halted last year on account of nesting - will now be carried out week commencing 05 December 2022. Tree surgeon, Alex Cills, has agreed a return to site. Of the remaining trees to be felled, Alex will then mill, hold and dry a small quantity of 'our' hardwood at his premises. This will be returned to Cromarty for the manufacture of street furniture (or a similar community project) at a later date.

Construction - in a single phase - is provisionally timetabled from January to March 2023.

We recognise this is an important new asset for the community; and we will put out a call for a 'community planting day' once construction works are concluded, and the site is again safe to access.

Operating Cromarty Community Campsite

At the start of November 2022, CCDT made an application to the Development Trusts Association Scotland (DTAS) for funding which supported furtherance of our remit.

We applied for £3K, for IT support, to develop a website for CCDT and the online booking system for the Campsite.

We have just had confirmation that this has been awarded with a spend by 31 March 2023. We will be working on this from December 2022 (in the background) ready for launch in Spring 2023.

East Church Hall

In November 2022, CCDT applied to the Highland Council and the Common Good to host a community 'doors open day' for the East Church Hall. Permission has been granted, with a date to be arranged in the New Year.

Thank you to everybody who has already made contact with CCDT to date about a potential use; it's exciting to consider new life being breathed into the East Church Hall. In return we will follow this through and make contact with all of you individually, over December 2022 and into the New Year, for a more detailed discussion.

This is signalling that there is indeed an interest in the building and demand for the space going forward; and needs to be addressed in the Community.

Strengthening Local Partnerships

Over the past six months, we have now formed a working relationship with CDCC. Although operating as discrete organisations with our own remits or focus, there is clearly a lot of common ground.

CDCC & CCDT recognise that through working together and having a regular exchange, we can share resources, effort and energy where we can.

2023 Onwards

The appointment of the Trust's Development Officer in June 2022, has been a significant milestone in the CCDT's evolution, allowing us to expand what we do.

We aim to make sustainable change through community led projects, infrastructure and development. Through creating or unlocking opportunities - big or small - we will bring energy and focus to our works and continue to deliver for Cromarty in the year to come.

Cromarty Care Project

At the AGM on 7th November, Denise McIntosh took over from Jill Stoner as Chair and Alison Seller was appointed Secretary, replacing Nigel Shapcott. Both Jill and Nige will remain as Trustees. The Trustees would like to express their deep appreciation of the work that Jill has undertaken and the legacy for the community that she has created under her leadership of Cromarty Care. That leadership now passes to Cromarty lass, Denise, who brings her own youthful energy and optimism. Also, Dr Helen Charley has retired as Trustee. Helen has been cheerfully engaged with Cromarty Care since its earliest days in 2015 and has contributed much to the organisation. She will continue to be involved in one particular 'baby' of hers - the Classic Cinema Club for the over-60s, which meets on the second Wednesday of the month at Cromarty Cinema. Scottish Italian Awards


