Port anounced of Nigg а partnership with Highland Ferries to extend the operation of the Nigg-Cromarty Ferry service for an additional two months this year. The service will now start in the first week of April, providing increased connectivity for local communities and visitors. Under the agreement, Port of Nigg (owned and operated by Global Energy Group) will fund the extended ferry service, ensuring greater

PoN, along with the supply chain businesses on site, recognise the importance of reliable transport links for both locals and businesses. accessibility across the Cromarty Firth during the busy spring months. The Highland Council will contribute by covering the cost of concession tickets for eligible foot passengers.

Dougie Robertson, owner of Highland Ferries, sees this is as a significant step towards strengthening the ferry's long-term sustainability and said, "We are excited about this development and our growing partnership with Port of Nigg. This funding not only benefits commuters but also enhances tourism opportunities in the region. Over the last 12 months we've invested in key improvements to the service, including new adapted access and upgraded engines. 


East Church

Dr Jim Mackay of the Kirkmichael Trust will tell the stories behind our local marriage lintels and date stones, with copious beautiful images of the often extravagant carving on these stones. The focus will be on Cromarty, but with examples drawn from every village in the Black Isle, as well as some from Easter Ross and Inverness. Jim will be relating the tales, sometimes sad sometimes amusing, of the people behind the inscriptions on these stones.

Dr Jim Mackay is Chair of the Kirkmichael Trust which maintains medieval Kirkmichael in the Black Isle, subject of an award-winning restoration. He is a popular speaker, his lively talks combining information with entertaining stories. He is the author of 'Resolis "Slope of Light" Guide to a Black Isle Parish', 'Tales from Kirkmichael' and 'Guide to Jemimaville and the Colony "Reachfar") creative home of Jane Duncan, author'. J

Orlagh joins Allan on the C&DCC



Youth Members are full voting Members of the Community Council (although not allowed to appoint other Youth and Co-opted Members) and are the democratic voice of young folk in the Cromarty & District community. But they are also so much more as invaluable members of your elected Team of Members, led by the (also youthful) Paige Shepherd as Chairwoman, supported by Associate Members and our existing Secretary and Minute Secretary (non-voting), Claire Fraser (also youthful!). The Youth Members might well bring down the average age of the Team but their voice is the future of our Community. Allan already leads the C&DCC Winter Resilience and has been instrumental in making sure the Stagecoach School bus service is keeping to its important timetable. Allan and Orlagh are also involved in the Associated British Ports/Youth Highland initiative to look at creating meaningful future employment for young folk on the Black Isle. It's been a busy month for CCDT.

Julie Macrae, our development officer has finished her contract and we'd like to thank her for all she's done for our town – without her, there would be no campsite. Hayley Muir (Community Events & Marketing Coordinator), Phoebe Fox, Fiona Deakin & Ronald Young (Directors) have taken over different aspects of managing and promoting the campsite. Hayley is also managing this year's Open Gardens – see separate item in this newsletter.

We have produced a Business Plan for the East Church Hall to go to Highland Council soon, and an application for funds to make the building work for the community. We are working hard with the different parts of Highland Council to align the various timescales and opportunities. We still hope to have access by autumn this year.

We are hopeful that we'll get a year's funding for a new Development Officer post and we have a Job Description/Person Specification ready. They would take on a range of community development work - hopefully including making the East Church Hall into a going concern - and other work across the Trust.

We contributed to a consultation workshop on Community Benefits from Renewable Energy, where we strongly made the case that communities near the CONSTRUCTION of renewables infrastructure should also see community benefit monies.

And we are delighted that Rory Mackay has officially started his Apprenticeship in Timber And Landscaping SCQF Level 5, building on his experience of doing exactly that kind of work at the Campsite.


St Regulus Church building in Cromarty is open most days during daylight hours -
