3 Chairman's report

3.1 Submission to BDUK

As a result of our submission to BDUK all the postcode areas currently covered & planned to be covered by CMNet have been reclassified to have basic broadband provision; previously these were unclassified. Basic broadband means a service delivered via ADSL lines rather than fibre and speeds below 30 Mbps. I.e. we are now in the same classification as Plockton.

One installation has been completed but is waiting for the installation of mains power so the subscriber can confirm they have a connection.

We have one request for a new connection this month, the kit is configured, and we just need a predictable dry day to complete the installation.

In the past new subscribers have been given a five week grace period at the start of their contract; one week to confirm all their equipment works with CMNet and four weeks to allow them to terminate their BT contract without penalty. This ensured no one had to pay for two internet connections simultaneously and was effectively a 10 % discount on the first year's subscription. CMNet has now been live for six months and we consider the existing relays to be stable and since we started there have been no network problems with subscriber's own equipment.

There are a group of potential subscribers who could have been connected to the existing relays but have not yet done so and it was decided we should drop the five weeks grace period for this group as they have had enough time to commit to a join date.

The five week free usage concession will still apply to subscribers waiting for new relays to be erected but will be reviewed after a period once the new relays are considered stable.

7 Customer Relations

7.1 Production Environment

7.1.1 Problems and complaints

There was one power outage in May, everything recovered without our intervention. On one occasion there was a problem with the management report which did not automatically send out emails, it recovered automatically the following day but Phil will alter the program to retry to connect to the email server more times.

7.1.2 Usage quotas

May's usage (221 GB) increased by 53 GB over April's (168 GB for a 30 day month), on a daily average adjusted for different number of days in the month this equates to an increase of 27%. The highest days' usages last month were; 13.4, 11.8, 11.7 and 9.9 GB with no performance issues reported on these days. If we used 13.4 GB per day for a 31 day month our usage would be 415 GB, if we used 10 GB per day we would use 310GB. I.e. the peak day's usage figures suggest we may have additional spare capacity of between 194 GB & 90 GB per month however this is not an exact science. After some debate it was agreed we will offer an additional 50 GB increase to the combined total quotas in June. Joe will contact the candidates to confirm their requirements.

Five subscribers have exceeded their quotas in May. Two subscribers have exceeded their quotas three times in the past year and according to their contract should now increase their quotas to the next band. However it was decided we would offer another option; if they exceed their quota again we will automatically suspend their service for the remainder of the month. Apart from emails at 60% and 90% usage there will be no advance notice and it will not be possible to reconnect the service until the following month.

We have again been asked to provide a tariff for an unlimited monthly usage quota. Unfortunately this would be too expensive to offer whilst we have to use the existing ADSL lines. However we will review tariffs at the end of this financial year and see if we can find a way to offer higher monthly quotas.

8.6 *ISPs*

8.6.1 Community backhaul, West Coast Backbone (WCB)

Phil circulated more information about the HUBS West proposal to the directors.

Phil attended a meeting on 29th May at SMO on Skye with others interested in the WCB and also met with Peter Buneman separately on the 2nd June to get more detailed background information. Although the details are yet to be finalised and confirmed the situation can be summarised as follows:-

The UoE (University of Edinburgh through Peter Buneman) is expecting to receive a grant from the Scottish Government to fund a research project to investigate, set up and test a high speed backbone for the West Coast.

There are monies for capital expenditure on equipment and to fund staff to provide services and research.

In April 2014 the nearest location to obtain a leased line was Fort William but in recent weeks more facilities have become available and it is now expected to be possible to obtain a leased line in Mallaig and / or Kyle, both of these locations are subject to confirmation. The initial link will probably be through Mallaig.

It is expected very high speed leased lines will be available; I Gbps (1,000 Mbps) i.e over 70 times as fast as our current two lines combined. The economies of scale will also reduce the unit costs considerably. Typically doubling the cost of a leased line will increase the capacity by a factor of 5 or more. Unlike our current ADSL telephone line a leased line is not shared with any other user. I.e. the capacity is for the sole use of CMNet; because of this more CMNet subscribers can share the same bandwidth on a leased line.

For example to provide 5 Mbps bandwidth to our current 24 subscribers as a percentage of a 1 Gbps leased line would reduced our internet charges by 80%. However the reality is more likely to be that we will want to keep our costs the same and increase our bandwidth and capacity to provide a more reliable, more consistent and faster service.

HUBS West has been renamed WHAN CIC, West Highland Access Network. For speed it is being set up by three individuals in the first instance and as details become clearer Community Broadband groups are expected to join.

There will be a meeting of all interested community broadband groups in the near future to disseminate information. For the moment we have decided just to follow developments.
