Phil raised the issue of ongoing ad-hoc purchases now we are starting to build new relays. It was agreed that we would put a limit of £250 on purchases that can proceed without prior approval from the board, anything above that will need approval before purchase. All claims will need to be accompanied by invoices as before.

The annual payment for hosting the Ardaneaskan relay is due on the 1st October. Action: Georgie

5.1 Year five tariff

The total number of gigabytes sold was 3,440; the break even tariff for 2 fibre lines is £0.60 per 20 GB, and for 3 fibre lines is £0.89 per 20 GB.

Phil produced projections for next year's tariff based on a standing charge per installation and a rate per 20GB.

After some debate working through various pricing options it was decided to take a cautious approach to the likely income next year and not assume that there will be any significant increase in individual subscribers' quotas and that we might not connect all 35 outstanding subscribers. As in previous years we have budgeted for a modest surplus which will allow us some leeway for system upgrades.

It was agreed that the year five tariff will be as follows:-

The standing charge per installation will remain at £5 per month.

The quota charge will be reduced to from £1.50 to £1 per 20 GB.

The new tariff will come into effect as it has on previous years on the 1st December.

This will increase the new joiner's premium by £24 (£0.50 reduction in the lowest quota rate x 48 months) to £156 Subscribers will become eligible for the new reduced rate when they have paid the new joiner's premium and this will vary from subscriber to subscriber depending on the date they joined and their monthly quota. We will write to all subscribers informing them individually of their new monthly charge giving them at least a month's notice so they can reduce their standing order payment.

We will retain the charge of £13.50 for the lowest quota rate of 20GB for new joiners which will mean the premium will be paid off over the first 21 months of membership.

New joiners on 40 GB or more will pay the premium off over the first twelve months of membership at £13 per month in addition to the standard quota rate.

Rates for existing subscribers who have paid the premium (old rate in brackets):-

20GB @ £6 (£6.50), 40 GB @ £7 (£8), 100 GB @ £10 (£12.50), 400 GB @ £25 (£35)

Rates new for subscribers who have not paid the premium (old rate in brackets):-

20GB @ £13.50 (£13.50), 40 GB @ £20 (£19), 100 GB @ £23 (£23.50), 400 GB @ £38 (£46)

Once the new joiner has paid the premium they will be eligible for the new reduced rates.

If any existing subscriber is close to the maximum of their current quota and would like to take advantage of the reduced rate to increase their quota would they please let us know when we inform them of the new rate.

7 Customer Relations

7.1 Production Environment

7.1.1 Problems and complaints

The system has held up well this month despite the ever increasing demand giving us the highest ever monthly usage. There was a power cut on the 19th for almost four hours due to a Hydro line fault, on restoration of the power all units came back on line within 10 minutes.

There have been several brief outages of the relay in Ardaneaskan; these were caused by power supply problems.

As Joe is still having problems updating firmware Phil will bring all the spare units up to the current standard. Action: Phil. Joe

Two customers in Braeintra are experiencing poor signal levels; we will try a hardware upgrade to the Braeintra access point. No progress this month. **Action: Phil, Joe**

There have been no new reports in the Ardaneaskan and Craig logs of RADAR being detected. Closed

Ubiquiti software upgrade - offline units will be upgraded when they next come online. Action: Phil

There have been a few unknown "local" IP addresses recorded this month, the source is being investigated. Action: Phil

7.1.2 Usage quotas

The monthly total for August was 2.45 TB, with a daily average of 79.1 GB; a very, very large increase on the previous month, the peak usage was 107.7 GB on Tuesday 25th.

Eight subscribers exceeded their quota and have been moved to the appropriate band.

7.1.3 Possible virus infection

No new instances of the Ubiquiti virus were detected; we will continue to run scans. Action: Phil

The suspected infection of subscriber's equipment has been confirmed as a virus attack on their server. Closed

7.1.4 Installation of equipment

7.1.4.1 Ardaneaskan

The subscriber has cleared the line of sight of undergrowth and their antenna is now back online; we will reconfigure their router on our next trip. Action: Phil, Joe

One subscriber has completed their pre-installation work and we will complete their installation on our next trip. **Action:**Phil. Joe

The spare AirGateway will be collected on our next trip. Action: Phil

7.1.4.2 *Craig*

The link from Craig to Ardaneaskan is now live after extensive testing using various pieces of equipment. Although the link is delivering speeds in excess of 30 Mbps it does not have the same margin as other links, which will restrict future speed increases. It would appear that the rise and fall of the tide is having a periodic effect on the signal strength and hence the capacity of the link. It has been decided that we will review the situation when we have more experience of low level links over water or other options become available. **Action: Phil**

7.1.4.3 Achmore

There have been no new installations this month as we are waiting on subscribers.

7.1.4.4 Other installations

Work has started on the new relays on Creag Mhaol. Phil and Mary spent several days on Creag Mhaol ferrying up equipment and cable and drilling rock for the footings of the new masts. This task could not have been carried out had it not been for Phil's Argocat. When the new relays on Creag Mhaol are live we will start work on the Portchullin and North Strome relays. Action: Phil, Mary, Joe, Georgie, Neil

8.3.3.1 Existing relays

We will investigate hardware upgrades as the next step to reduce noise on the links. No progress this month. **Action: Phil** 8.3.3.2 New relays

Work has started on the new relays above Strome Ferry.

The scaffold for Strome High and Strome Low has been erected and the line of sight to the various targets has been checked. 7 drums of 100 metres SWA cable have been moved up to the top of the hill and the first 500 metre cable run marked ready to join the cable.

Work has started preparing 5 enclosures to house power distribution and electronic equipment. One existing enclosure on Achmore High is badly corroded and will be replaced so it can be removed, examined and repaired if feasible.

The next tasks are - build one more scaffold to house a new power distribution enclosure above Strome, install all the new enclosures, mark the remaining 2 cable runs, join the cables and provide power to the new relays. This will mean a series of interruptions to the service whilst the existing mains power supply on Creag Mhaol is altered. Action: Phil, Mary, Joe, Georgie, Neil

One access point will be upgraded to see if that will reduce the noise levels. No progress this month. **Action:** Phil
