- 4 Public participation session.
 - 4.1 District Cllr. Phil Cowen said that his Council had started to bring staff back into the office, and hoped that this would be able to continue. They had maintained all their services during the pandemic, apart from a few minor issues with bin collections. He said that some changes to collection dates for the future would soon be advised to all residents (whether it affected them or not). The budget for 2022/3 would be approved at the February meeting, and he expected this would be a balanced budget, which would include an increase in Council Tax of £4.95 p.a. for s Band D household. He also gave an update on the situation regarding the outstanding planning applications at Cherry Tree Farm, saying that none of these will be determined until the Environment Agency have finished dealing with many breeches of their permits.
 - 4.2 A Member of the Public raised concerns about the weight restriction on the bridge on Mere Road, where the sign positions were too late for a vehicle in excess of the limit to do anything about it. He also asked about the verges and ditch at the junction of Cherry Tree Lane and Mere Road, which were in a very poor state. The Clerk said he would get on to NCC Highways about both issues.

The Council then **agreed** a more detailed response to this application, objecting on a number of grounds, including it being contrary to Policies ENV 02, ENV 05, ENV 06, TR 02, EC 07, and COM 03.

His emails to County Cllr. Fabian Eagle asking for assistance had also received no responses. It was **agreed** that the Cllr. White should write to Tom McCabe, Head of Paid Service at NCC in an attempt to get a response.
- 10 Stow Bedon Fuel Allotment. The Chairman confirmed that the Allotment had now been sold to Norfolk Wildlife Trust, and the Trustees have placed the funds in an investment. As Chairman of the Trustees he has instructed solicitors to prepare the documents for the transfer of Trusteeship to the Parish Council, with the target of getting this completed at the end of the financial year.
- 11 Budget 2022/23. The Clerk presented a draft budget for 2022/23 which was approved.
- **Precept 2022/23**. It was **agreed** to fix the Precept for 2022/23 at £6,000, an increase of £850, which will amount to an increase of 11p/week for a Band D property.
