# **Pupil transitions:**

There are currently 24 children on roll. We have 6 pupils due to leave year 4. 5 pupils are going on to Bellingham Middle School; one is going to Hexham Middle School. We are expecting two children to come into reception in September 2018.

#### Governance:

We are currently looking for parent governors to support our school. Adverts have been repeated several times over the last few months. Mr. Anthony Gibson was appointed a chair of governors earlier this year. Mrs. Amy Murray became vice chair.

## Consultation:

In November 2017, Northumberland County Council (NCC) began an informal consultation process to look at the structure of education in the West. This included all schools within the Hexham and Hayden Bridge partnerships. Phase 1 of the consultation began in February 2018. This involved schools, pupils, parents, governing bodies and local communities submitting individual and group responses to their opinions of the consultation. Three suggested models were presented of how 'Education in the west' could look. Unfortunately, in all three models, West Woodburn First Schools was suggested to close.

We launched a 'Save our School' campaign along with 16 other schools who had also been threatened with closure. The local community showed their support to save our schools. At the end of April the outcomes for the consultation had been scrutinised and a fourth alternative model was suggested. This model saves Hayden Bridge high school, closes Bellingham Middle school and provides a promise to all first schools that they will be supported to turn into primary schools. These new primary schools have to agree to form a federation with another or group of schools or become part of a Multi-Academy-Trust (MAT). In May 2018, and a cabinet committee met and approved this model and a statuary proposal is now going ahead. Over the next 4 weeks NCC will be coming out to schools to facilitate the move to a two tier (primary and secondary school) system. A final decision will be made by the cabinet and be made public on 10<sup>th</sup> July 2018. It is still possible for letters, comments, questions and concerns to be sent to Andy Johnson at NCC, Guy Opperman (M.P) and councillors Wayne Daley and John Riddle before this final date.

Please accept our sincere apologies for being unable to attend this evenings meeting. The door is always open at school and we welcome any comments anytime. We hope to see many of you at our next open morning in the summer term.
